Business owners are also encouraged to spread the word, as one lucky restaurant will also win a free Promotional Partnership with Discover Albany for 2021 worth \$500.

Capital Region locals are encouraged to share photos of their meals on social media with the hashtag **#LoveAlbanyRestaurants** to highlight Restaurant Appreciation Month and spread the word.
