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Sport Impacts Greater Lansing in a Big Way! Region to Host Five Different National Sports Events Over the Next Seven Weeks

LANSING, Mich.— The Greater Lansing Sports Authority (GLSA) is proud to announce the region will play host to multiple national level events beginning February 25 through April 10. Collectively mid-Michigan will welcome over 3,000 athletes from across the U.S., competing in judo, wrestling, archery, and bowling, all of whom will bring additional coaches, officials and spectators looking to fill hotels, restaurants, shops and more.

Mike Price, executive director of the GLSA states, "These events kick off a strong year of sports tournaments for our community after all the pandemic-related disruptions to the sports industry. There is nothing like developing collaborations that give youth a chance to compete while also fostering economic development for the region. Greater Lansing is highly respected as a tournament destination. We can't wait to showcase our many offerings to the visiting athletes, officials and spectators."

Often the GLSA will work for years to court events to the region. The team builds extensive relationships with hospitality partners, sports venues, and local organizing committees to find the perfect mix of amenities a group may be seeking. The services they provide are largely free, but the economic benefit of sport tourism on the local community is tangible. These five events alone are expected to generate significant economic impact for the Lansing region.

The first event to kick off the roster will be the 2022 USA JOAD and Indoor Nationals.
