

# **Visit Hershey & Harrisburg Career Connections Day**

Industry Professionals, College Students, Recent Graduates, and Educators Connect to Discuss Careers in Hospitality & Tourism

(Harrisburg, PA | March 16, 2022) -- To address the hiring and job vacancy challenges facing the Hospitality and Tourism industry, Visit Hershey & Harrisburg (VHH) partnered with the School of Sport, Tourism and Hospitality Management at Temple University (STHM @ Temple) to facilitate a day of education and networking to highlight the benefits and opportunities that come with careers in tourism-related fields. VHH Career Connections Day took place at the PA Farm Show Complex & Expo Center on March 16, 2022 – almost two years to the day after businesses in the Hershey Harrisburg Region and across the world began to close, transition to remote work, or otherwise drastically adjust traditional operating procedures due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

The day-long agenda featured site tours for students and recent graduates to learn about a variety of venues and attractions in the Hershey Harrisburg Region such as the Pennsylvania Farm Show Complex & Expo Center, Hershey's Chocolate World, and Hersheypark®. The students then joined VHH Partners representing attractions, hotels, event venues, restaurants, wineries, and breweries for panel discussions and rotating roundtables.

More than 50 students and faculty from Temple participated along with more than 20 VHH partner businesses including Hershey Entertainment & Resorts, Hershey's Chocolate World, Harrisburg Senators, Hilton Harrisburg, Cocoa Kayak, The Vineyard & Brewery at Hershey, Dauphin County Parks & Recreation, Adventure Sports, Staybridge Suites Harrisburg Hershey, and more.

"We developed this event to collectively address the challenges facing the state of the tourism workforce and to do so in a way that encourages discussion by shedding some of the time constraints of a traditional job fair," said VHH Director of Sales Audrey Bialas. "Dynamic leaders in the tourism industry highlighted the many professional development paths available in fields like hotel, venue, and event management, sports tourism, catering, and marketing & communications, while educators and students had the opportunity to talk with those experts about what's important to them in their potential career paths," Bialas said.

According to U.S. Travel Association (USTA), roughly one in six (or 1.8 million) of job openings in the United States were in leisure and hospitality entering Q4 2021. "Hiring is not keeping up with the pace with new openings, so we hope events like this can provide a boost to the perceptions of the variety and quality of rewarding career opportunities in tourism," Bialas said.

Restoring the depth of the tourism workforce is critical to the region's economy. Prior to the pandemic, the Hershey Harrisburg Region traditionally welcomed more than 10 million visitors annually with visitors cumulatively spending more than \$2 Billion. "As traveler sentiment continues its positive trend and guests return in greater numbers for getaways, meetings, sports, and special events, we must do our part as

leaders in tourism to help rewrite the narrative about careers in the industry and help to spark excitement so that our workforce can effectively and excitedly meet the demands of increased travel," says VHH President and CEO Mary Smith. "The success of our efforts as a Destination Marketing Organization to drive tourism to the region relies in large part on the health, happiness, and growth & development of a strong and energetic workforce working in concert to provide world-class guest experiences," Smith continued.
