Fun-filled summer season features Pride and Fourth of July celebrations, a concert series, unique movie experiences, and more on beautiful Catalina Island

AVALON, CALIF. EVENTS:

Catalina Pride: June 18

The first large-scale event of its kind on the island, the <u>Catalina Pride</u> celebration will be held from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. and feature live entertainment at Wrigley Stage, a beer garden, a festive Pride March in support of the LGBTQ+ community, and more. <u>DJ Asha</u>, a six-time veteran performer for LA Pride, and DJ N.8, a regular at Legacy Nightclub in Newport Beach, will be playing sets throughout the day, along with performances by drag queens, the Long Beach Cheer squad and disco roller skaters. In addition, the historic Catalina Island Casino will be lit in vibrant rainbow colors to showcase Catalina's love and support for the LGBTQ+ community. More information can be found here.

Catalina Island Concert Series: June 25, August 20 and September 3

The City of Avalon will host Movies on the Beach on <u>South Beach</u> every other Wednesday from June 29 to August 10. Films begin at 7 p.m. and snacks and refreshments are available for purchase. Fourth of July Celebrations: July 2-4

Catalina Island will be celebrating the Fourth of July all weekend long with festive activities for families and kids of all ages. Kicking off on July 2, the 36th Annual Children's Festival at Two Harbors returns for a day of crafts and activities starting at 10 a.m., followed by a dinghy parade at 2 p.m. covering the West End of the island. On July 3, visitors can enjoy patriotic performances from the acclaimed USC Marching Band at Wrigley Stage from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. On July 4, festivities will be going from morning to night with a golf cart parade at 1 p.m. along Casino Way, live music throughout the day, a dinghy parade on the water, a BBQ dinner buffet at Descanso Beach Club featuring another chance to see the USC Marching Band, a firework show over Avalon Bay, and more. Catalina Comedy Island: September 9-10

The Avalon Theatre Reopens: June 16

Following a two-and-a-half-year hiatus, <u>The Avalon Theatre</u> will mark its reopening season on June 16 with movies and events held every Friday and Saturday evening through Labor Day. Under new operation from actor, producer and long-time Catalina patron Wesley Alfvin, the theatre will be reimagined as a preforming arts center, featuring current and classic films as well as live entertainment – from live music and comedy to magic shows. New General Store at Hermit Gulch Campground

Hermit Gulch Campground is Avalon's only camping facility located within city limits. A home base for first-time and experienced campers alike, the self-service campground offers tent sites along with canvas tent cabins. The newly added general store located at the Ranger Station features camping essentials, 3.5 oz and 8 oz propane, snacks (ice cream, soda, chips, etc.), and Hermit Gulch merchandise exclusive to the store. Catalina Express Summer Schedule

Catalina Express has expanded its schedule from its three convenient ports in San Pedro, Long Beach and Dana Point to nearly 30 ferry departures daily. Cyclone Power Boat to Two Harbors

Transportation between Avalon and Two Harbors via the Cyclone, a seasonal high-speed power boat has resumed daily services. The 40-minute boat ride is the fastest way to travel between the two locations, providing visitors an opportunity to explore both ends of Catalina in the same day.
