## United States Wheelchair Rugby Association National Championship Returns to Rockford

Athletes competing in one of the fastest growing wheelchair sports in the world will soon be on the road to Rockford. The United States Wheelchair Rugby Association (USWRA) National Championship returns to Rockford and will take place at the UW Health Sports Factory from April 1, 2022 through April 3, 2022.

Opening ceremonies start off the event Friday, April 1, 2022 at 8:50 a.m. with the first game beginning at 9 a.m. Games continue throughout the weekend with the last game played at 12:30 p.m. Sunday, April 3, 2022. Awards will follow afterwards featuring the athletes and tournament directors.

The United States Wheelchair Rugby Association National Championship is the largest co-ed wheelchair rugby tournament in the United States and consists of 41 games taking place over three days. The best 16 teams (160 athletes) in the country will come to Rockford to compete and determine who will be crowned

National Champion. Marengo, IL-based Oscar Mike Foundation will not only host the tournament, but will also compete, and is the only sanctioned wheelchair rugby team comprised of military veterans that competes in the USWRA. "Our partnership has led to our facility being the host site for the National Tournament for a second time, again bringing athletes from all around the country to our facility. This is a high energy sport

that is amazing to watch," said Derek Papich, UW Health Sports Factory program supervisor. The tournaments hosted will be open to the public to attend. There is no cost to spectate.

The USWRA is a nonprofit which provides oversight, development, and administration to the sport of wheelchair rugby across the United States. Since 1988 the USWRA has been promoting and supporting wheelchair rugby to provide competitive athletic opportunities to eligible people with disabilities and to empower people to reach their full potential in all areas of life. The USWRA features over 40 teams with more than 500 athletes across the country.
