## Official Pocono Mountains Travel Guide Returns for 2022-2023 Distribution underway across five states, 800 locations

July 12, 2022 – The <u>Pocono Mountains Visitors Bureau</u> (PMVB) is pleased to announce the return of its popular travel guide, "Pocono Mountains Magazine," for 2022-2023. 200,000 copies are being distributed throughout July to 800 locations across New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and Maryland.

The PMVB partners with <u>Bailey Design & Advertising</u> to create the guide in both print and <u>digital</u> versions. The free publication is updated annually and serves as the official guide to help guests plan their getaway to the four-county region with features such as insider trip ideas, suggested itineraries, and a pullout map. The guide includes information about <u>small towns</u> in the Poconos, <u>things to do</u>, <u>places to stay</u>, <u>restaurants and dining</u>, <u>midweek getaways</u>, and new for 2022-2023, a spread on the newly revamped <u>Pocono Beverage Trail</u> experience.

The travel guide is available in high-traffic locations such as PA welcome centers, <u>PMVB visitors</u> <u>centers</u>, 49 PA Wawa Convenience Stores & Gas Stations, two large travel shows in New York and Washington, D.C., rest areas, turnpike plazas, and AAA offices. Consumers can also <u>request to have a travel guide mailed directly to them</u>.

"In addition to browsing the travel guide, visitors can learn all about the region by watching the <u>Pocono Television Network</u>," said Chris Barrett, President/CEO of the Pocono Mountains Visitors Bureau.
