Projects Over \$2.2 Million Economic Impact to the Capital Region

Today/December 6, the Connecticut Convention & Sports Bureau (CTMEETINGS) welcomes the 2022 USA Cycling Cyclocross National Championships to Hartford's Riverside Park at 20 Leibert Rd. Riverfront Recapture, Inc. is hosting the six-day event and many area organizations and businesses are ready to greet this prestigious competition.

"This race is one of USA Cycling's four major national championships with more than 1,600 athletes coming from all over the nation to compete for 34 national titles, including categories qualifying for the UCI Cyclocross World Championships," explains Michael Zaleski, President & CEO of Riverfront Recapture, Inc., the private, non-profit organization that manages Riverside Park. "The USA Cycling Cyclocross National Championships was first held in Riverside Park in January of 2017, and it moves to a different city and course each year. The organizers' and participants' responses to our race venue in the Capital City was so positive that USA Cycling chose to return here again."

National championship titles will be awarded in age groups from 11 years old up to age 70 and older. The event also features a festival atmosphere with food trucks, beer, and an age 10 and under Fun Lap.

"We welcome this dynamic outdoor tournament and the thousands of the visitors it will bring to the Greater Hartford region," says Robert Murdock, President of the Connecticut Convention & Sports Bureau (CTMEETINGS), the state's official meetings and sports events sales and marketing organization. "With over 1,600 competitors, hundreds of coaches, officials, staff and supporting vendors, plus thousands more spectators, the six-day event is projected to generate more than \$2.2 Million* in revenue for the Greater Hartford region."

"CTMEETINGS is managing the tournament's hotel reservation process and has booked rooms in at least 15 hotels in Avon, East Hartford, Glastonbury, Hartford, Manchester, Southington, Windsor and Windsor Locks, with the Hartford Marriott Downtown serving as the event's host hotel," adds Murdock. "Spending by visitors at local restaurants, attractions and hotels during the tournament will support more than 480 tourism-related jobs and will result in over \$160,000 in sales tax revenue for Connecticut." Admission to the championships is \$20 for attendees who are ages 11 and up, and wristbands can be used for the entire championships.
