10 Favorite Places to Enjoy the Outdoors in the Rockford Region

Here are 10 of our favorite places to enjoy the outdoors in the Rockford region.

1. Severson Dells Nature is one of the premier outdoor adventure spots with several hiking trails and an interactive kids area that allows children to explore their natural environment in a variety of unique games and activities.

2. West Rock Wake Park allows you to get outdoors and wakeboard! No boat or experience required! Plan a girls night, get the kids in the water or get a monthly membership!

3. Pecatonica Prairie Trail is a 14.3 mile rail-trail extending from the western edge of Rockford to N. Farwell Bridge Road, west of Pecatonica, IL. Bike, hike and enjoy passing through a landscape of farmland, wetlands, meadows and woods. Stop in the small villages of Winnebago and Pecatonica to eat and shop local.

4. Rock Cut State Park, one of Northern Illinois' larger state parks, offers camping, hiking, kayaking, paddle boarding, swimming, horse and bike trails, cross country ski trails, ice skating, and concessions. Fifty-acre Olson Lake is especially for swimmers. At the Outdoor Store, guests can rent kayaks, canoes, paddle boards, row boats, and fishing boats for use on Pierce Lake (162 acres).

5. Colored Sands Forest Preserve on the Sugar River near Rockton is known for its birds – and the bird banding at Sand Bluff Bird Observatory, its unique geology, and wonderful wildflowers. It offers outstanding panoramic views of the pristine Sugar River. Because of its sandy soil, Colored Sands Forest Preserve supports many plants, and their associated wildlife, that are not found anywhere else in the county.

Visit this preserve and 43 more, all a part of the Forest Preserves of Winnebago County.

6. Rock River Recreational Path winds behind the YMCA, through Sinnissippi Gardens, past Symbol, to meander through Shorewood and Martin Parks in Loves Park. Walk or bike right along the beautiful Rock River.

7. Baumann Park is adjacent to the Kishwaukee River in Cherry Valley. A paved pathway runs through the park and loops around Baumann Park Lake. The park offers a playground, baseball fields, tennis and basketball courts, and picnic areas. Plus, fishing is allowed in the lake.

8. Anderson Japanese Gardens has been named one of the highest quality Japanese gardens in North America by Sukiya Living Magazine since 2004. Inspired by calm and tranquility, this 12 acre award winning landscape is comprised of koi-filled ponds, winding paths, gentle streams, cascading waterfalls, raked gravel gardens, beautifully trained pines, and more. Master craftsmanship and 16th century traditional architecture is found throughout the garden.

9. Klehm Arboretum & Botanic Garden is Rockford's "living museum", filled with rare trees, special gardens, unique features and more. At 155-acres in size and with over 1.5 miles of paved, accessible paths and over 2.5 miles of unpaved trails, Klehm has something for everyone to explore. Be sure to bring the family to check out the Nancy Olson Children's Garden and it's "Kid's Creek" natural play water feature and splash pad!

10. Nygren Wetland Preserve is a 721-acre tract near the confluence of the Rock River and Pecatonica River, making it an important stopover and nesting spot for many species of birds including Sandhill Cranes. The Natural Land Institute, a private, not-for-profit land conservation organization, owns the preserve and began restoration of prairies, wetlands and woodlands to the area in 2000.
