#### **NEW EVENT: First Peoples Festival**

Jan. 12-14, 2024

Estes Park has partnered with Nico Strange Owl, a member of the Northern Cheyenne Tribe of Montana, to celebrate Indigenous culture, art, music, language, oral traditions and much more during the inaugural <u>First Peoples Festival</u>. Shop cultural vendors from various tribal affiliations across the country, listen to live music performances, and enjoy traditional dances, singers, and

drumming. Learn about the deep Indigenous connections to the Estes Valley and Rocky Mountain National Park and take part in cultural demonstrations and workshops. Events include:

- Indigenous Inspired Dinner (Jan. 12): Enjoy a special Indigenous-inspired meal at Twin Owls Steakhouse, along with amazing performances, a participatory sweet grass offering and a blessing by a Northern Cheyenne Elder. Meet Indigenous demonstrators, educators and workshop teachers. Reservations required.
- Indigenous Vendor Market & Workshops (Jan. 13-14): Head to the Estes Park Events Complex, where vendors from tribes from all over the country will showcase traditional Acoma pottery, Iroquois beadwork and quillwork, Navajo jewelry, caribou antler art and much more.

At the Estes Park Events Complex, spend a winter's day sampling sweets from the region's finest chocolatiers, tasting pours from a variety of Colorado wineries and enjoying live music. ## WINTER EXPERIENCES IN ESTES PARK

When venturing into <u>Rocky Mountain National Park</u> this winter, be sure to check their website in advance to get the latest road closures and safety information related to winter weather. Remember that it can get cold this time of year, with temperatures ranging between the 20s to the 40s. Don't forget to bring good footwear, warm jackets, gloves and hats to protect you from the cold.

#### Winter Wildlife

Winter is a great time to take a walk on Estes Park's and RMNP's wild side. Journey to Moraine Park and see elk, deer, and coyotes throughout the winter months. Birders may find a winter wonderland filled with white-tailed ptarmigan, dusky grouse, wild turkey, northern flicker, downy woodpecker, mountain chickadee, pygmy nuthatch and pygmy owl. Lake Estes is also a great place to spot bald eagles! Find more info about winter wildlife.

## Sledding at Hidden Valley

No winter is complete without at least one or two sledding adventures. Head to RMNP's Hidden Valley to zoom down a snow hill. No sled (or tube)? No problem. The playful can <u>purchase or rent equipment</u> from one of the outdoor gear or sporting goods shops in town. Be sure to check <u>current sledding conditions in Hidden Valley</u> online or with park staff upon entrance as it can be closed at times.

## **Backcountry Skiing**

Quickly becoming legendary for real steep and deep slopes, <u>Rocky Mountain National Park</u> offers backcountry skiers and splitboarders a variety of terrain, difficulty and altitudes – up to 14,000 feet! New to the backcountry? Sign up for safety courses and/or guided group excursions through <u>Colorado Mountain School</u> and <u>Kent Mountain Adventures</u> before venturing out. And avalanche safety awareness is vital — <u>here are five reasons you should take an avalanche course</u>.

## Ice Skating at the YMCA of the Rockies

As far as picture-perfect natural ice-skating spots go, the experience at <a href="YMCA of the Rockies">YMCA of the Rockies</a>'

Sweet Memorial Program Building and hit the ice – there's no need to be a guest at the YMCA to participate. Or, enjoy the serene beauty of the snow-covered mountains gliding over a frozen pond at <u>Trout Haven Resorts</u>. Ice skates are available for rental or bring your own, and hot chocolate and coffee are served to warm you up when you get chilly.

# **Snowshoeing in RMNP**

Take a walk in the snow. <u>Kirks Mountain Adventures</u>, <u>Yellow Wood Guiding</u>, <u>KMAC Guides</u>, <u>FemmeTrek</u> and <u>The Estes Park Mountain Shop</u> offer guided snowshoeing trips into Rocky Mountain National Park that range from 3 to 8 hours. No experience is necessary, and equipment is available at both locations. Always stay on the designated trails for the best views of glacier lakes and scenic mountains. Rocky Mountain National Park also offers a variety of winter programs, including ranger-led snowshoe walks.
