Beer, wine, Pepsi products and Aquafina water will be available for purchase. Yappy Hour is free with park admission (\$2 per person or free with the Gold Pass) and no registration is required.

The dog park at James Island County Park has acres for your pup to run and play. It features separate fenced-in sections for large and small dogs and a large lake where dogs can swim and play (wildlife is present so pets should be monitored closely). The park also offers a dog washing area, water fountains, benches and nearby restroom facilities.
