- Teachers and chaperones are asked to sit interspersed with their students so they can deal immediately with any problem that may arise, so when allocating tickets, please keep this in mind.
- Have you checked to discover if the production has an education resource pack and workshop opportunities?
- Have you checked the cancellation/exchange policy of the venue?
- Have you checked the travel times and transport links?
- Have you checked the running time of the production?
- Are you concerned about any of the trigger warnings that are listed in this Guide?
- If your school requires a risk assessment, have you contacted the appropriate person at the venue as listed in this Guide?
- Have you discussed theatre etiquette with your students as found in this Guide?
- Have all of your students read and agreed to the behaviour and etiquette contract?



Theatre Etiquette

As you know, Society of London Theatre (SOLT) is committed to bringing young people to West End theatre. However, our ability to organise affordable school rates from West End producers is helped by the good behaviour of school groups as there are times when students' behaviour causes undue grief to other patrons, the actors and front of house staff! To that end, we're asking you to advise your students of these basic theatre etiquette rules, in an effort to improve the theatre experience for everyone.

Please read the following to your students. We suggest that you ask your students to sign the Behaviour Contract included in this Guide. We'd also ask that you take full responsibility to ensure that your students are aware of the appropriate behaviour expected in the theatre.

Thank you for your co-operation.

For the teachers:

- All students need to be told that they're attending a performance where other (paying) members of the public will be present. These audience members expect to have an enjoyable experience that it is not ruined by poor behaviour of school groups. Actors are also aware of the audience and disruptions can affect their performance.
- There should be a minimum of one teacher/adult chaperone to every 10 students.
- Teachers and adult chaperones must sit interspersed with the students, to deal immediately with any problem that may arise. (Teachers should not sit all together at the end of a row.)

Students need to be told that:

- Students' phones and watches must be switched off during the entire theatre performance. This also means no texting, as actors and others are distracted by the light.
- Students should be quiet throughout the performance. If they speak to one another, actors can hear them and it is very disturbing to other patrons.
- Students should not eat food during the performance. Of particular concern is the opening of sweet packets, the crunch of crisps, etc., all of which can be heard by other theatregoers and the actors. During the interval, students can eat food they've brought or purchased.
- Students should try, if at all possible, to restrict their visits to the toilets to the interval.
- If students misbehave, the ushers will remove them from the theatre.
