

2008 Southern League All Star Game "Experience the Magic of Baseball"

Hosted by the Carolina Mudcats Monday July 14, 2008 Five County Stadium

Zebulon, NC --- The "Magic of Baseball" is coming to Carolina, courtesy of the 2008 Southern League All-Star Game to be played at Five County Stadium in Zebulon, NC on Monday, July 14th.

During this two-day span, the Mudcats, Five County Stadium, the Town of Zebulon, Wake County and the Miracle League of the Triangle will join hands in becoming the epicenter of the Southern League, hosting the 37th annual All-Star game.

The "Magic of Baseball" theme will be pronounced throughout the All-Star experience, beginning with an All-Star Gala dinner on Sunday, July 13th, followed by a luncheon on Monday afternoon. The All-Star festivities will open with a magical game preceding the main event. The Miracle League of the Triangle, a league for school-aged children with special needs, will play a game on the field in conjunction with the Southern League All-Star players and coaches. The children will be wearing All-Star Game t-shirts, complete with their names and numbers, have their pictures on the Mudcats' video board and approach home plate with their own personalized introductory walk-up music. The custom All-Star jerseys that the Southern League All-Stars will wear will be auctioned off during the game and the proceeds will be donated to the Miracle League.

The 37th Annual Southern League All-Star Game, which will feature the premier prospects in the game, and a post-game party, will complete the "Magic of Baseball" experience.

"It is an honor and a privilege to be involved in the All-Star Game and the Carolina Mudcats baseball organization," said Tammi Ditmar, Executive Director of the Miracle League of the Triangle. "Opportunities like this happen once in a lifetime. For our children and their families, this is a long, lost dream come true. To play the game of baseball with "real" players will change the lives of these players and families forever. Thank you on behalf of the Board of Directors, families and our players."

"Wake County is proud to support Five County Stadium and our Carolina Mudcats as they are tapped to host the 2008 Southern League All-Star Game," said Joe Bryan, Chair of the Wake County Board of Commissioners. "It's a great opportunity to showcase our County's hospitality and athleticism to visitors from around the region, and it builds on the economic and recreational benefits we already enjoy in eastern Wake County. The Southern League All-Star Game, the fourth featuring the North pitted against the South, will be the second time Five County Stadium has hosted the contest, although in 1997, the game assumed a much different format and flavor. A decade ago, the circuit's top prospects joined into one club to defeat the Seattle Mariners 9-3.

Details regarding festivities, tickets, sponsorships, broadcasting arrangements and other pre-game events will be released in the coming weeks.

The 2007 All-Star game was held at Trustmark Park in Pearl, MS with four Mudcats named to the Northern Division team. Carolina 3B Lee Mitchell earned MVP honors in the North's victory.
