LEG 1

Perth to Bunbury (via Harvey)

186 kilometres

- Get your first taste of South West cheese, wine and fresh produce in Harvey.
- Visit the vibrant port town of Bunbury – home to more than 100 wild bottlenose dolphins. Learn more about the dolphins at the Dolphin Discovery Centre.
- Take a self-guided tour of Bunbury's award-winning wine region, the Ferguson Valley.

LEG 2

Bunbury to Margaret River

107 kilometres

- Take your pick from over 100 wineries, as well as fine restaurants, boutique breweries, art galleries and fresh produce stores.

LEG 3

Margaret River to Pemberton

139 kilometres

- Head deep into tall karri tree country to reach the old timer milling town of Pemberton.
- Taste some of WA's top wines at Pemberton's cellar doors – the perfect accompaniment to a feast of fresh local flavours, including Pemberton's finest delicacy, marron.

LEG 4

Pemberton to Perth (via Manjimup)

327 kilometres

- Get a taste of the sensation that's coveted by top chefs the world over – Manjimup black truffles – as well as a few more cool climate wines.
