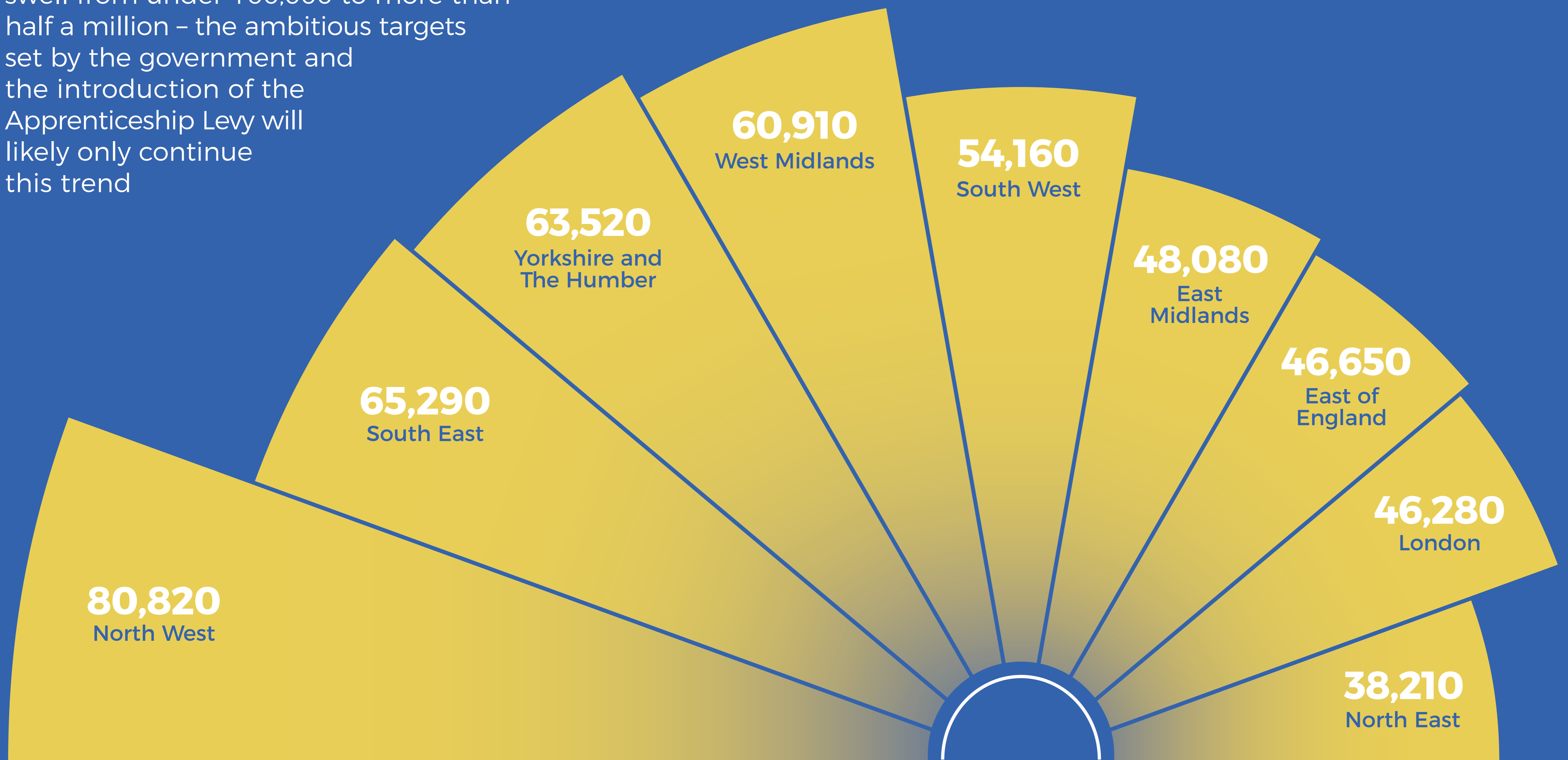
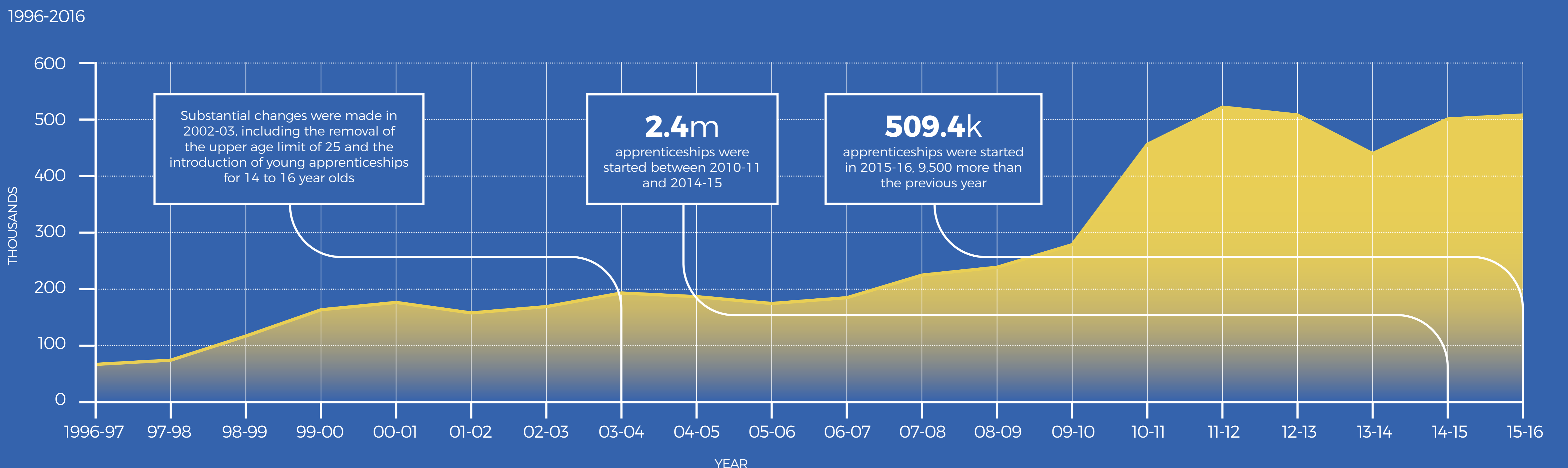


APPRENTICESHIPS IN NUMBERS
