

WOMEN AT THE TOP

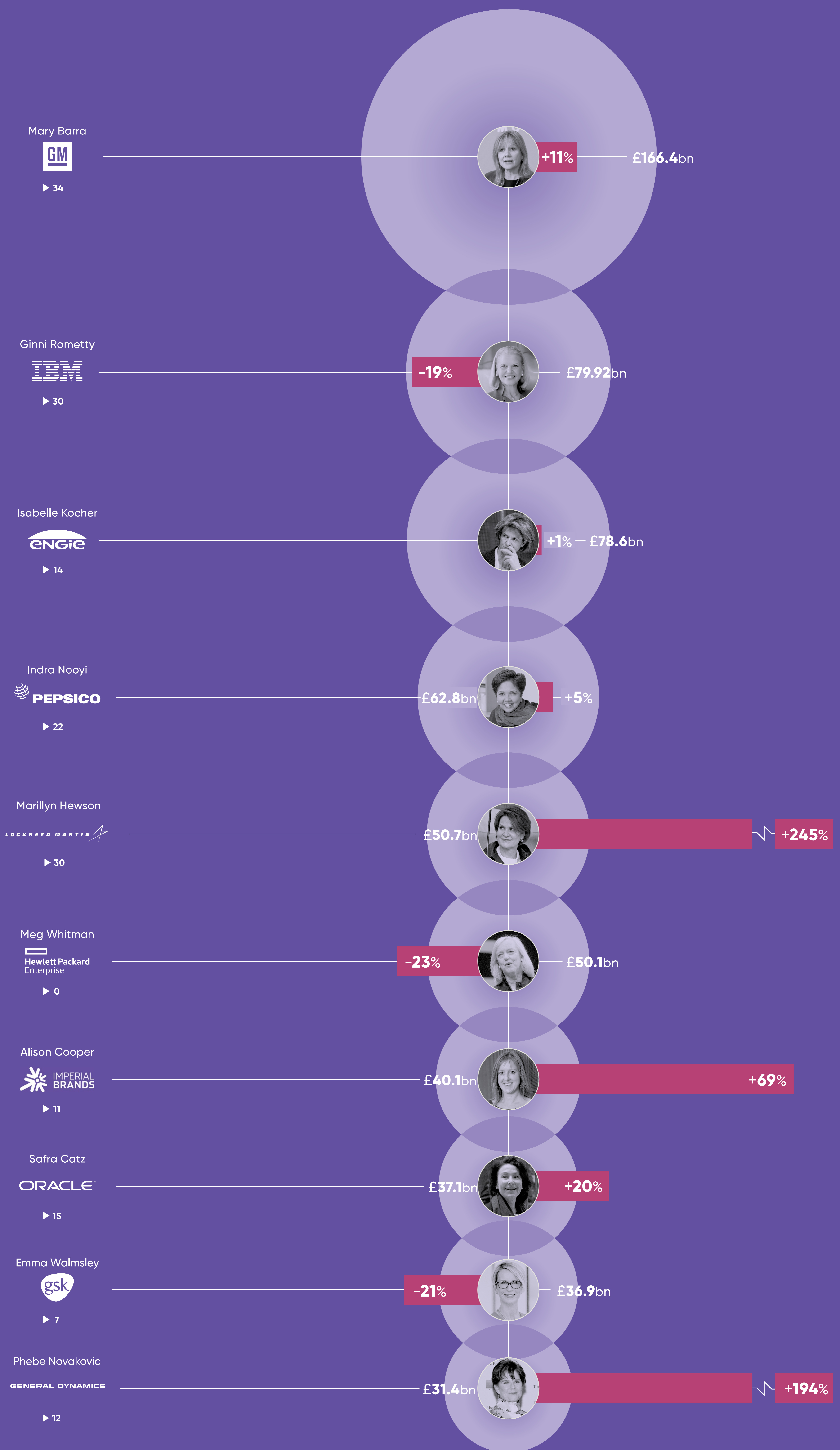
Female representation in the boardroom is on the rise. And while there are more and more women heading up some of the world's largest blue chips, the number of female chief executives is still embarrassingly low. In the FTSE 100 alone, the number of CEOs named either David or Dave (eight) outnumbered the total number of female bosses (six). This infographic explores the largest companies led by women worldwide and how female CEOs got to where they are today

SELECTED PUBLICLY LISTED COMPANIES BY REVENUE

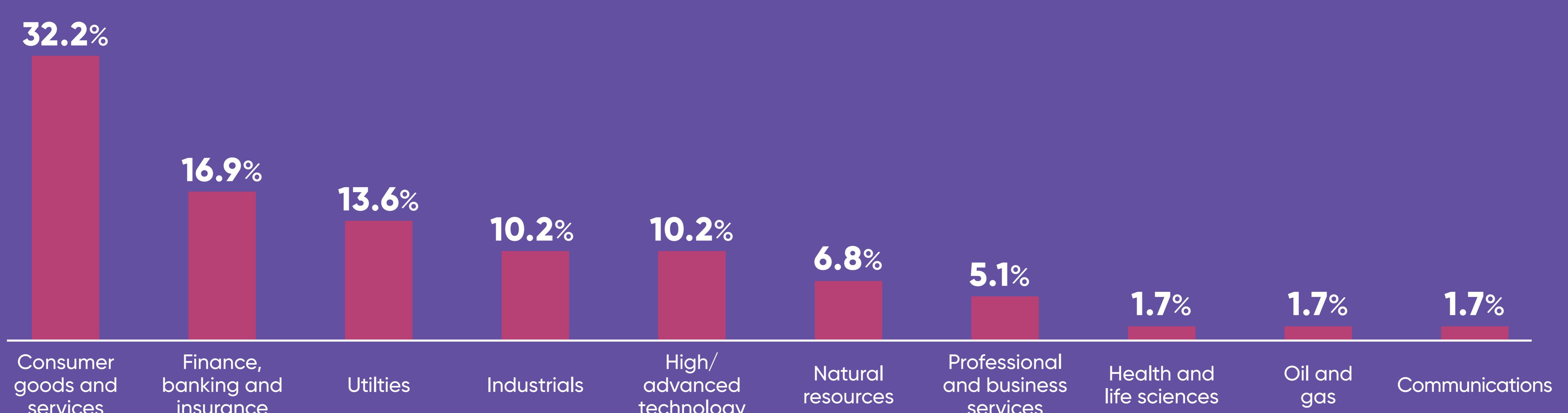

TAKEN FROM A SAMPLE OF CURRENT AND FORMER FEMALE CEOs IN THE FORTUNE 1000



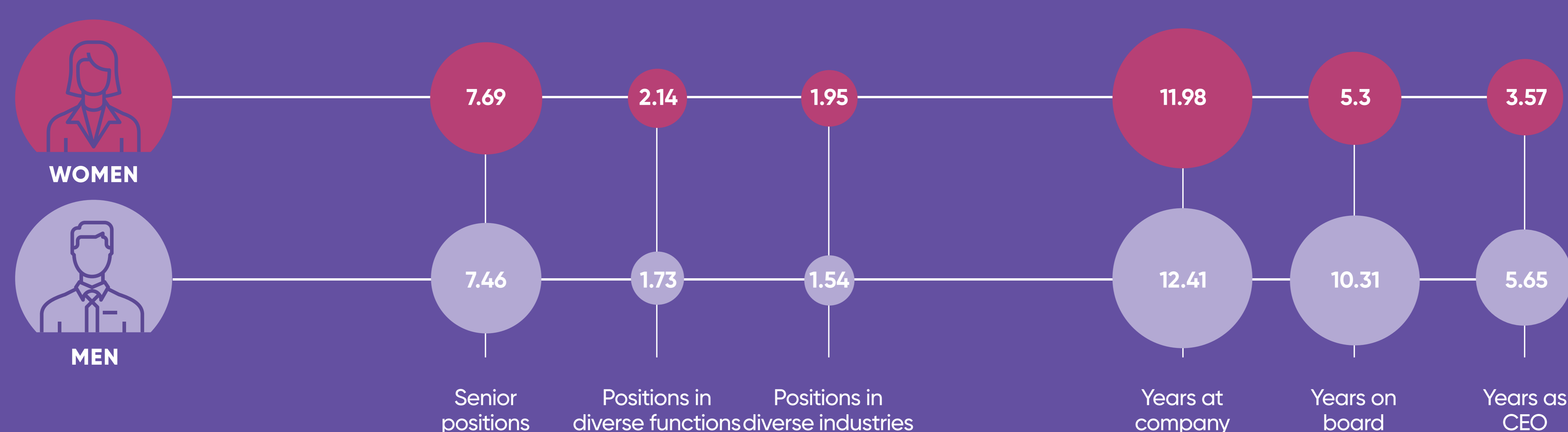
