LAUREN MOLINA (Broadway's Rock of Ages and Sweeney Todd; Mary Zimmerman's Candide— Helen Hayes Award; Marry Me a Little) and NICK CEARLEY (Pageant: The Musical; first national tour of All Shook Up; on the OUT 100 list as one of the most compelling actors of 2014) met in 2003 performing in Theatreworks USA's national tour of Just So Stories. Quickly becoming best

friends and musical collaborators, they began performing together in New York (with clothes on). The Skivvies were born in 2012 when they became YouTube sensations with their unique covers of artists like Robyn, Carole King, and Rihanna. The videos led to live shows, and now this undie-rock, comedy-pop duo continues to perform to sold-out audiences in New York and beyond. Previous venues include their residency at 54 Below, 42 West, Highline Ballroom, Roseland Ballroom, Joe's Pub at The Public Theater, The Cutting Room, Rockwell: Table & Stage in Los Angeles, The Smith Center in Las Vegas, the Williamstown Theatre Festival, the Huntington Theatre Company in Boston, City Theatre in Pittsburgh, Bay Street Theater, the Kimmel Center in Philadelphia, the Red Barn Theatre in Key West, and the Bucks County Playhouse. The Skivvies have performed at events such as Broadway Bares (raising money for Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS), A Tribute to Angela Lansbury with Tyne Daly and Christine Ebersole, Broadway for Obama, a Human Rights Campaign benefit, and Theatre C. They have made appearances on NBC and filmed pilots for FOX, A&E, and WE tv. They also have a single, "Hardbody Hoedown," and a music video directed by Augusten Burroughs. Theatrically, Molina and Cearley performed off Broadway together in Sex Tips for Straight Women from a Gay Man, and were cast as Brad and Janet in The Rocky Horror Picture Show at the Bucks County Playhouse.

RANDY HARRISON is currently touring the country playing the Emcee in Roundabout Theatre Company's Tony Award-winning production of *Cabaret*. Best known for playing Justin Taylor on Showtime's *Queer as Folk*, Harrison has appeared on Broadway in *Wicked*; off Broadway in *Harbor* (Primary Stages), *The Singing Forest* (The Public Theater), *Antony and Cleopatra* (Theatre for a New Audience), and *Edward the Second* (Red Bull Theater); and at such regional theaters as Yale Repertory Theatre, the Guthrie Theater, and Shakespeare Theatre Company in Washington, DC. Television and film work includes roles in *Mr. Robot, Bang Bang You're Dead*, and *Such Good People*.
