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Encore—Connecting Arts, Culture and Community.

Encore Media Group acknowledges that we are on the lands of the Duwamish People. and their other Coast Salish relations—past and present. American Conservatory Theater is an essential gathering place that brings artists and communities together to inspire and provoke. Now four years into the leadership of Tony Award—winning Artistic Director Pam MacKinnon and Executive Director Jennifer Bielstein, A.C.T. is charged with fulfilling its mission to engage the spirit of the San Francisco Bay Area, activate stories that resonate, promote a diversity of voices and points of view, and empower theater makers and audiences to celebrate liveness. A.C.T. is a Tony Award—winning nonprofit theater serving almost 200,000 people in the San Francisco Bay Area annually through theater, training, education, and community programs. The organization values inclusion, transformational learning, participation, and rigorous fun.

A.C.T.'s MFA Program is the last freestanding graduate acting training program in the country not affiliated with a university. We have determined that in order to thrive, the program must be in partnership with a university as is modeled throughout our field. At this point in time we do not have a partnership in place that would enable us to continue the MFA Program, so it will end with the Class of 2022. We remain deeply invested in delivering the highest-level of training to the final class, and there remains the opportunity to support them through the Melissa Yandell

Smith Legacy Fund. We honor and celebrate the tremendous impact the MFA Program has had on individual artists and on the American theater as a whole.

While the graduate training program is coming to an end, A.C.T. is steadfastly committed to transformative learning by maintaining its Conservatory, which offers a robust array of theater-based classes and training programs, including Studio A.C.T., the Young Conservatory, Summer Training Congress, San Francisco Semester, and Institutional Professional Development. These programs help participants discover their inner artistry, while also training the artists who will shape the cultural landscape of our society.

In addition, our Education & Community Programs bring theater and arts education curricula to schools and community-based organizations across the Bay Area. For an entire decade, these programs have provided annually close to 20,000 young people and educators from around the region with opportunities to experience the transformational potential of dramatic storytelling, critical thinking, creation through collaboration, and fun, and have fostered the artists and audiences of the future.



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REMEMBERING MELISSA YANDELL SMITH BY AVANTHIKA SRINIVASAN

Melissa Yandell Smith, captain of her high school field hockey team and a double Yalie, whose voice could be recognized out of a thousand, was a woman unlike any other. When I first met her in February 2016, I knew she'd change my life, but little did I know how profoundly and in how many ways she would do so. Though she had run A.C.T.'s MFA Program for decades and was known to be the epitome of tough love, what struck me was how joyous yet vulnerable and sensitive she was. She led with an air of simplicity, which contained profound knowledge and experience, not just about acting but also about life. Every moment in acting class was filled with awe and wonder as I watched her observe qualities in students they themselves weren't aware of. Through countless hours in class and in her office discussing what it meant to bring one's authentic self to acting, she taught me how to embrace my identity. As an Indian immigrant, I spent a lot of time rejecting my culture and trying to assimilate into what it meant to be American. But because of her. I started singing again. I started going to temples again. I started to value the qualities in myself that I had spent so much time rejecting.

After I graduated, our friendship blossomed to include weekly phone calls and FaceTime sessions, moments that became the highlight of my days as she would offer invaluable advice on navigating life as an artist in New York City and would share her own experiences as a young woman pursuing her dream of being an actor. And no conversation would be complete without discussing the next book we'd read together or the next up-and-coming restaurant we had to try. Though her battle with cancer progressed over the years, her outlook on life never changed. During my visits to San Francisco to spend time with her, I noticed that no matter how she was feeling that day, she would approach every task with such curiosity and grace. Three days before she passed, we took a drive to Land's End, a trip that would be her last excursion. As we sat for an hour and looked out onto the Pacific Ocean, she reflected on her life and her time at A.C.T. with pride and contentment. It was a moment that made me realize what a huge part of her life the MFA Program had been, and how those 25 years not only shaped the students she taught, but also her as a person. **Melissa's legacy lies in the students she** trained. To me, she will forever be my teacher, mentor, best friend, and family. Though she may not be present physically, she continues to speak to me in her own way and will forever

inspire my journey as an actor and as a human being.

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FREESTYLE LOVE SUPREME

COMES TO THE BAY

A.C.T. is the first stop on the *Freestyle Love Supreme* national tour. We chatted with three cast members about their Bay Area connections, working on a show that changes every night, and their favorite hip-hop artists from the Bay.

What makes the Bay Area the perfect launchpad for *Freestyle Love Supreme* in 2022?

Aneesa Folds: Many members in our group have roots or have lived in the Bay Area at some point. It comes up a lot on stage so I know how much it means to them. I'm excited to soak in the city and the beautiful people who live in it. I hope to see a diverse audience that appreciates hip-hop, improv, and theater.

Andrew Bancroft: I lived in San Francisco for 13 years and have lifetime friends and memories here. Some of the first times I freestyled on stage were in Oakland. The Bay is where I reconnected with Anthony "Two Touch" Veneziale. He and I started a sister group to FLS called The Freeze, where we rapped with Daveed Diggs and James "J-Soul" Iglehart. Some of my favorite comedy performances were with my buddy Kenny Taylor as well as the sketch group Killing My Lobster. The Bay is constantly reinventing itself through creativity, and I can't wait to be here for a full month interacting with Bay audiences.

Anthony Veneziale: I lived in San Francisco for 15 years, and coming back to the Bay feels like a homecoming. We have so many friends and family out here—the Felonious crew, The Freeze, Mortified, and of course there's an improv company I co-founded with

Sammy Wegent called Speechless that still lives out here and does shows at Club Fugazi. It's a triple Mitzvah.

What are you bringing from your Bay Area roots into the show?

Bancroft: I try to bring a little of that Oakland rap battle energy into shows. We stay very positive on stage, but there are moments where we get to express frustrations in a funny way. I feel like the Bay's hip-hop scene also has a strong history of fusing intelligence, playfulness, and activism. If we can take even a little inspiration from artists like Hieroglyphics and E-40, we'll be doing all right.

Veneziale: I will be using every neighborhood insight (I see you Mission burritos/new fancy highrises downtown/fog in the Richmond/

commuters in the Dogpatch) that I can possibly muster into each show. Whatever the hometown crowd wants to give us—we will run with it. I'm just sad to see Buster Posey retiring.

How do you describe the origins of a show that is being rewritten every night?

Veneziale: The show started out as a way to check in with your friends and hear what's good—it's based on the Black art form of hip-hop born in the Bronx. Let me tell you about my day, my community, my life. We paired that with the art form of improv comedy which started as a way to help immigrant kids speak their authentic voice in Chicago (thank you Viola Spolin).

What are the fun and challenges of creating a new show every night?

Folds: Our show is completely made up every night. We get our words, stories, and ideas from the audience. They are a member of the show and we can't do it without them. That's what makes Freestyle Love Supreme so unique and special.

Bancroft: We try to break out of any patterns or habits that we find ourselves forming. That's why we take new words and stories from the crowd every night, rotate the cast, and the musicians adapt to everything as well. The best way for us to keep things fresh is to truly LISTEN to the audience. There's infinite variety baked into the crowd each night.

What do you hope the audience will take away from *Freestyle Love Supreme*?

Folds: I hope they walk away feeling joy. It's what we need most in the world right now. After spending a year and a half inside, being able to connect with humans has been a beautiful thing. Can't wait to laugh with you San Fran!

Bancroft: The past 2 years have been incredibly trying for people. We've been isolated from one another and stuck in an echo chamber of bad news. While we can't change those headlines, we can create an hour and a half of true connection. Our show is a moment to truly listen to each other and turn our experiences into music, laughter, and even tears.

Who are your favorite hip-hop artists from the Bay Area?

Folds: Tupac, Shock G, and Kamaiyah.

Bancroft: I mentioned E-40 and Hieroglyphics, and of course you have to shout Too \$hort. I also love a lot of the Quannum projects, like Blackalicious and Lyrics Born—brilliant lyrics and delivery. Can't forget Shadow for turntablism. And how can I miss our boy, Daveed Diggs?!

Veneziale: The Hieroglyphics, E-40, Mac Dre, Daveed Diggs, clppng, Souls of Mischief, Del the Funkee Homosapien, Digital Underground (2Pac), if we include Sac then Blackalicious too!

-SPOTLIGHT ON SALESFORCE

It all began with a tweet.

When A.C.T. board member Rusty Rueff saw that Salesforce CEO Marc Benioff raved about Broadway's Freestyle Love Supreme on Twitter, he knew that it was an opportunity for partnership. A.C.T. was bringing the show to the Bay Area, and who better to collaborate with than a leading company in our community? Our development, marketing, and artistic teams came together and produced a personalized video message to Benioff, complete with a freestyle rap from FSL co-creator and cast member Anthony Veneziale. Rueff's idea was a success, and Salesforce agreed to partner with A.C.T. to provide subsidized tickets for our Bay Area community. "I believe the arts have the power to transform lives and lift communities," says Benioff. "As we begin to safely return to live, in-person performances, I am honored to assist A.C.T. in making this production more accessible for all in the San Francisco Bay Area."

Salesforce's deep commitment to the local community made it the perfect partner for A.C.T. While many tech companies left the area during the pandemic, Benioff and Salesforce were vocal about their decision to stay, emphasizing their loyalty to the region. 

MICRO-COMMISSIONS TO THE GEARY

With Freestyle Love Supreme, A.C.T. is not only celebrating our long-awaited return to live, in-person performance, but also the first fruits of a new initiative. During the pandemic, we invited a group of brilliant, necessary artists to create Make-a-Thing micro-commissions. Our only directive was that the artist should channel the impulses that felt most urgent and necessary to them into a short creative project—in other words, to "make a thing." Whether it was a piece of writing, a short film, an installation, or something else entirely, as long as it was something that the artist felt driven to create, we were happy.

As conversations about what constitutes "essential" work filled the news, we at A.C.T. and our artist collaborators have been forced to interrogate the necessity of art and creativity. In a time of profound uncertainty, we decided to trust our artists to show us the way forward. The visionaries who took up our challenge are:

At A.C.T., we are fiercely protective of the theater's role as a refuge for rich spoken language and we swoon over plays that leave us word-drunk, but we are equally passionate about theater's other creative languages: image and spectacle, sound and music, the movement of bodies through space. We believe in the generative capacity of artists of each of theater's sub-disciplines. We have commissioned choreographers, directors, actors, and designers, as well as writers. We are profoundly grateful to these wonderful artists for daring to create in a time of destruction and loss, for making something new among the ashes of the old.

We invite you to experience the first of our Make-a-Thing micro-commissions across our lobbies today. You'll see more of them in the months to come. Over the last years, each one of us has carried a weight of inestimable loss upon our shoulders, and I suspect I'm not alone in feeling occasional despair. Activist and philosopher Maxine Greene said that "imagination allows for empathy, for a turning in to another's feelings, for new beginnings in transactions with the world." At A.C.T., we are preparing for our own new beginnings. It is in such times that we need artists the most.

EDUCATION & COMMUNITY PROGRAMS

CELEBRATES TENTH ANNIVERSARY

This year marks the ten-year anniversary of A.C.T.'s Education & Community Programs department. In the decade since its founding, the department has reached over 125,000 students, teachers, and community members, partnered with more than 40 schools, and collaborated with 112 teaching artists.

It all started with two women and one cold call. In 2011, Eunice Nuval, an educator working at Downtown High School (DHS), was looking for a partner organization for her students. "I was going down a list of theaters in San Francisco, and I thought, why not call the most high profile one?" she recalled. "No one else answered the phone, but Elizabeth did."

Elizabeth Brodersen was A.C.T.'s newly appointed director of education. Formerly the publications editor at A.C.T., she was aware of the needs of schools and educators in the Bay Area from producing education guides: to support the student matinee (SMAT) program. She met with Nuval at DHS, and an ongoing partnership was born.

"It was really focused and intentional," said Nuval. A.C.T. teaching artists would host workshops in writing, acting, and theater production skills at DHS, and the high schoolers visited A.C.T. for classes every Wednesday. Nuval said her students were transformed by the experience. "It changed attendance for us. The students gained public speaking and writing skills. Some of them had never been to the theater. [The program] brought them a sense of belonging, that this is also their city."

Brodersen credits much of the success of the education department to many MFA students through the years, especially Nick Gabriel (class of 2009) and Tyrone Davis (class of 2012), both of whom continued working with the education department after graduation. Close to the high school students in both age and demographics, the MFA actors designed their own workshops in improvisation, writing, and performance for teens. Their dedication to community programs helped to establish the Citizen Artist curriculum, wherein each MFA student has the opportunity to work with partner schools and organizations.

The program's success has lasting impact on both organizations as well as the community at large. Downtown High School remains a valued partner, and A.C.T. added similar initiatives at Ida B. Wells High School, Hilltop Special Services Center, and Mission High School. Other partner organizations have included 826 Valencia, Tenderloin Boys and Girls Club, the Filipino Education Center at Bessie Carmichael Pre K–8 School, Larkin Street Youth Services, and Community Works West. Community building has been a tenet in A.C.T.'s strategic planning process, and the department officially became Education & Community Programs in 2013. As Nuval puts it, "We were always taught at A.C.T. that theater is about taking care of each other."


Wheelchair-accessible restrooms are located in Fred's Columbia Room on the lower lobby level, and the Garret on the uppermost lobby level.
