The Twelve Traditions

- Our members neither should come first, nor should recovery depend upon A.A. work.
- For our group purposes there is but one ultimate authority - working God as the way express himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.
- The only requirement for A.A. membership is a desire to stop drinking.
- Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups of A.A. in its area.
- Each group should have one primary purpose - to carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers.
- As in all other human relationships, friendship is essential to A.A. work. It is an added facility or valuable extension, but not a condition of membership, and should be based on the group's primary purpose.
- Every A.A. group ought to be fully self-supporting, bearing no financial burden on other groups, and being self-sustaining.
- Alcoholics Anonymous should remain non-institutional, but our service centers may employ qualified workers.
- A.A., as such, ought never be organized, but we may create service centers or committees directly responsible to those groups.
- Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues, hence the A.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy.
- Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we will never claim personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.
- Anonymity is the cornerstone of our Traditions, with respect to the public relations service centers.
