The essentials in brief



Travel documents

To enter Switzerland, you need a recognised and valid travel document. This can be a passport or an identity card. In some cases, a visa may be required.



Road fees

If you are travelling in a vehicle, road fees apply for driving on Swiss roads and motorways.



Goods and special cases

You must comply with certain regulations and may have to pay customs duties when crossing the border with goods. Special provisions apply to certain categories of goods (animals, vehicles, internet purchases).

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
Road fees

Depending on the type and weight of the vehicle, the following fees must be paid before using Swiss roads:



Up to 3.5 tonnes

You must purchase a vignette to use Swiss motorways for motor vehicles and trailers up to 3.5 tonnes. The vignette is available as a sticker or as a practical electronic version, the e-vignette. In both cases, it costs CHF 40.





Over 3.5 tonnes

A **lump-sum heavy vehicle charge (PSVA)** applies to foreign vehicles with a total weight of more than 3.5 tonnes.

1 kg/l of butter/cream? (CHF 16.-/kg or l)

5 kg/l of oils, fats and margarine for human consumption? (CHF 2.–/kg or l)



1 I of alcoholic beverages over 18% vol.*? (CHF 15.–/I)

250 cigarettes / cigars / heated tobacco products / cartridges containing nicotine for e-cigarettes or 250 g other tobacco products or 250 ml liquids containing nicotine for e-cigarettes or 25 disposable e-cigarettes* (cigarettes, etc.: CHF -.25 per unit; other tobacco products: -.10 per gramme; liquids containing nicotine: -.25 per ml; disposable e-cigarettes: 2.50 per unit)

*minimum age 17 years

Subject to customs duty

Customs duty is levied on the excess quantities.

The FOCBS does not refund VAT paid in a foreign country. Please contact the foreign seller or a company specialising in tax refunds.

Private goods

Private goods that can be imported duty free

- Goods temporarily taken abroad from Switzerland
- Goods temporarily brought into Switzerland by foreign travellers

Travel provisions

 Foodstuffs ready to eat and non-alcoholic beverages for the day of travelling.

Prohibited goods

Importing certain goods is prohibited and/or restricted (weapons, drugs, narcotics, cultural goods, counterfeit goods, medicines, etc.).

Vehicles

When importing a vehicle into Switzerland, you must comply with certain formalities and pay various fees.



Household effects, inherited goods and wedding trousseaux

If you are moving abroad or moving to Switzerland, you can bring your household effects, inherited goods and wedding trousseaux with you without paying any taxes or duties. An import written declaration is required.



Internet purchases

Consignments from or to abroad are considered commercial goods. The tax-free limit of CHF 150 does not apply to these goods.
