

WHAT IS SWS?

Student Worker Solidarity is a coalition of students. workers, and any New Yorkers dedicated to pursuing economic justice in our community.

WHAT ARE WE DOING?

SWS began as an impromptu group helping the Barnard Clerical Workers win back their Maternity Leave, Sexual Harassment, and basic Health Care rights.

Subsequently, SWS targeted the Indus Valley restaurant, which owed former employees hundreds of thousands of dollars in stolen wages.

After a judge forced Indus Valley to come to court, SWS was asked by the Faculty House workers to fight with them for a fair contract. SWS has rallied hundreds of students, workers, and professors because the lives of 35 families hang in the balance.

After conducting research on natural resource extraction with the sociology department at Columbia University, I pursued a fully-funded field research program in Bhutan during my final semester.

Using the country's largest national park as a case study, my work was conducted in partnership with a government organization, the Ugygen Wangchuck Institute for Conservation and Environmental Research (UWICER).

A variation of the study was recently published in Consilience, a sustainable development journal affiliated with CU. A recent variation of the project, a reflection on the nature of ethnography and travel, is currently being edited for publication.




