

Top 5 Ways to be Green in Alta - by Elise Lammers



If you use energy efficient light bulbs and you recycle but still want to do more to help the environment, here are 5 easy things you can do.

1. Use Less Water

While water covers 70% of the earth's surface, most of it is salt water. Fresh water sources are limited. One-third of the world's population still lacks access to clean water. What yo ucan do:

- Set your hot water heater to 120 degrees and wrap it in an insulating blanket.
- No one wants to do it, but low-flow showerheads can reduce water use up to 4 gallons per minute.
- Low-flow toilets can cut up to 45 gallons of water use per day and don't cost much more than a standard toilet.

2. Conserve Energy

Both <u>Rocky Mountain Power</u> and <u>Questar</u> offer easy energy rebate programs. Mail in receipts for your energy efficient purchases and they send you a check!

Plug everything into power strips and turn them off at night (they run around \$7-8). Even if your appliances are turned off, they can still pull 15-30 watts of electricity (audio receivers and mini-systems are the worst). But if remembering to turn them off is too much of a pain, a Smart Strip (\$40) detects whether your appliances are in use and will turn itself off and on accordingly.

3. Choose Your Foods Wisely

It's hard to commit to purchasing all locally and organically grown foods, but when making your grocery store purchases consider which foods have the biggest impact on the environment. If you're deciding between apples and bananas, for instance, think about carbon footprint. Provo (or even California) is much closer than southeast Asia.

 Are you remembering your reusable shopping bags? After unloading your groceries, try leaving them by the door so you'll be remember to take them on your next trip.



4. Don't Blast the Heat

Believe it or not, the slowest way to heat up a car is by starting your car, turning the heater to the hottest setting and blasting the fan. The quickest way is to turn the temperature control to cold, but leave the fan off until the engine is warm. Much like keeping the oven door closed, this traps heat in the cooling system and engine compartment, allowing the engine to heat more quickly. In winter, you should only need to run your engine for 30 seconds to warm it up.

5. Pump Your Tires and Don't Idle

• Keeping your tires properly inflated can improve your gas mileage by more than 3%.

Don't idle your car for more than 10 seconds. For every two minutes a car idles, it uses the same amount of fuel it takes to go one mile.
