

Alta Summer 2012 Conservation Management Summary

It was a big summer for Alta out on the mountain. Now that there is snow on the ground, here's a recap on the resource conservation management efforts by Alta Ski Area. With the help of two interns, Tyler Rowe and Leah Frick, and all our non-profit partners we accomplished the following:

- Planted 1,500 trees, 500 shrubs, 1,727 Forbs (flowering plants) – Totaling 3,727 native plantings
- Salvaged and transplanted an estimate of 10,000 native plants
- Completed 9 stewardship events accompanied by 1,655 hours of volunteer labor and time.
- Established a 500 plant native tree and shrub nursery
- Started a 6-year Tree Seedling Survival Study
- Mapped over ~1,000 acres for non-native plants and noxious weeds
- Pulled about 1,000 lbs of non-native plants and noxious weeds
- Placed 300 verbenone (anti-beetle) packets and mapped ~500 Limber Pine trees

The cold and dark months of winter are the time when we spend more time indoors and turn up our heating. It's also when our energy bills and our green house gas emissions tend to soar. While we all need to keep warm, there are a number of ways we can make our homes more efficient so we can keep the warmth in, the cold out and use less energy to stay comfortable.

Here are our top 10 tips for this winter -

- 1. Use heavy curtains to stop heat escaping from your windows.
- 2. Install insulation in your house (or top up old and thinning insulation).
- 3. Seal up gaps and cracks that let the cold air in.
- 4. Install pelmets on top of your windows.
- 5. Watch the temperature.
- 6. Close off any rooms that are not in use.
- 7. Let the sunshine in during the day.
- 8. Insulate hot water pipes.
- 9. If you can't heat the room, heat yourself.
- **10.** Maintain your heaters.
