Take The Bus This Summer

Utah Transit Authority is offering a summer pass for children and teenagers ages 6 to 18 to ride FrontRunner, TRAX, the S-Line streetcar and buses this summer. The passes can be used from June 1 to August 31. The cost of the pass is \$99 and can be purchased online or at UTA service locations. Jump on the bus and come up the canyon to escape the heat this summer. We have stewardship and educational events through the summer. UP—Leaves Midvale Fort Union @ 6:43 AM and Arrives in Alta @ 7:53 AM

DOWN—Leaves Alta @ 5:05 PM and Arrives in Midvale @ 6:15 PM

HawkWatch Bird of Prey Show & Hike

This summer Alta Ski Area is hosting a HawkWatch Bird of Prey Show and hike at Alta on Friday afternoons in July and August. A short bird of prey show presentation will take place inside the Albion Grill followed by a hike led by a local naturalist or biologist. During the hike, we'll learn how birds use Alta's natural resources to survive in a mountainous environment.
