



Scattered along the Pacific Ocean, off the west coast of Ecuador, the magnificent archipelago of volcanic islands known as the Galapagos is world-renowned for its unique wildlife and natural wonders, many of which are found nowhere else.

The Galapagos archipelago is a UNESCO World Heritage Site comprising 18 main islands, three smaller islands and 107 rocks and islets.

UP-CLOSE-AND-PERSONAL

Renowned for hosting a wide variety of wildlife that has evolved with no major predators for hundreds of years allows for exceptional viewing opportunities from a surprisingly close range in their natural habitat. Amble along with giant tortoises, meet birds-of-a-feather perched in nearby trees, and swim with marine iguana.

AN ABUNDANCE OF WILDLIFE

More than 80% of the Galapagos' animals and 30% of plant species are endemic — meaning they can be found nowhere else on earth. The giant Galapagos tortoise, land and marine iguana, sea lion, green sea turtle, stingray, three kinds of boobies, the Galapagos penguin, waved albatross, frigatebirds and flightless cormorant, are just a few of the incredible marine, wildlife and birdlife to be seen.

UNSPOILED ECOSYSTEMS

The majority of the islands remain uninhabited today and there are strict tourism laws in place designed to protect the biodiversity of these pristine ecosystems. Naturally one of the most biodiverse places on earth with 97% of its islands forming a protected national park, travellers can enjoy dense forests, volcanic lava tubes and picturesque beaches.

SWIM, SNORKEL AND SCUBA

The islands are well-known for their spectacular scuba diving and snorkelling spots. While some may offer better viewing opportunities than others, no matter which island you're exploring, you'll likely be swimming alongside sea lion and green sea turtle, with the opportunity to see hammerhead sharks, whale sharks, eagle rays, plus large schools of jack fish.

Travelling to the Galapagos Islands requires careful consideration and attention to detail. Contact your preferred Travel Specialist to assist with your travel plans.

GETTING TO THE GALAPAGOS ISLANDS

The main gateway to the Galapagos Islands is through Ecuador, specifically the cities of Quito and Guayaquil. International flights typically arrive at Mariscal Sucre International Airport in Quito or José Joaquín de Olmedo International Airport in Guayaquil.

There are two main airports in the Galapagos Islands where you can land: Seymour Airport on Baltra Island and San Cristóbal Airport on San Cristóbal Island. Most international flights from the mainland arrive at Baltra Island.


After arriving in Ecuador, you'll need to book a domestic flight from either Quito or Guayaquil to the Galapagos. Several airlines operate flights to the islands, and it's advisable to book through θ Beyond or your preferred Travel Specialist.

Once you land in the Galapagos, you'll immediately sense the unique environment and conservation efforts that are in place. From the airport, transportation and accommodation to your chosen island will be arranged with your Travel Specialist.

Rainfall	Warm season (Wet season): Occasional, light rainfall with warmer seas, making it the ideal time for snorkelling and swimming Cool season (Dry season): Characterised by a cool, dry mist known as "garúa". The sea is cooler, and there might be stronger currents, but this is also a good time for wildlife observation
Average temperatures	Warm season (Wet season): From 25°C to 31°C (77°F to 88°F) Cool season (Dry season): From 21°C to 27°C (70°F to 80°F)




Back in 1987, she was built for a private individual by Picchiotti Yachts, an Italian family business with a rich shipbuilding history spanning over four centuries since its founding in 1575. The Galapagos Explorer spent 25 years cruising the Mediterranean and Caribbean before she was brought to Fort Lauderdale in 2013 and sold to the former owners. In 2014, she was deployed to sail in the Galapagos as the islands' very first charter yacht, named Stella Maris. In 2024, she became part of the &Beyond family.

Over her years of service, she has undergone several refurbishments, the most recent under the care of &Beyond. Working with a local Ecuadorian designer, we created a contemporary space mixing local aesthetics with her European heritage. Drawing inspiration from the Galapagos, the interiors feature natural materials and marine tones. Intricately carved wooden miniatures of traditional local canoes, indigenous textiles, and historic oars are just some of the many distinctive pieces found on board.

The Galapagos Explorer also stands out for her technical advancements, which are scarce in these waters. Stabilisers make for a smoother voyage, bow thrusters for agile navigation, and a swim deck for easier embarking and disembarking. Every feature has been considered to provide guests with even more comfort and convenience. Securing the Galapagos Explorer as our first flagship vessel is a milestone achievement for &Beyond.

Since we began operating in the Galapagos in 2016, we have been searching for the perfect vessel. Finally, we have found it in this exclusive 38 m (124 ft) yacht.

Being one of the select few boats permitted to operate in this region is a true privilege. Our presence here is not just about exploration, but also supporting conservation eff orts and community initiatives. Arrival

NORTH SEYMOUR

AFTERNOON: Upon arrival at Seymour Airport on Baltra Island, you will be welcomed and transferred to the Galapagos Explorer.

North Seymour is the only island with two species of frigatebirds and the best place to watch the male's bizarre mating display. While walking around, watch out for the colourful land iguanas, lava lizards, and marine iguanas that are known to walk between your legs.

Swim and snorkel

SAN CRISTÓBAL

MORNING: Pitt Point: An uneven, uphill hike leads you to a cluster of eroded volcanoes sparsely populated by unique vegetation. Look out for the endemic San Cristóbal mockingbird and lava lizard along the way. Pitt Point is also the only breeding site for all three booby species – the blue-footed, red-footed and Nazca booby. For non-hikers, enjoy incredible birdwatching aboard a panga boat or swim and snorkel with tropical fish and sea lion.

AFTERNOON: Kicker Rock: This iconic rock rises 152 m (500 ft) from the ocean, formed from the remnants of a vertical tuff cone eroded by the sea. Sailing around the natural monument showcases the islet's dramatic cliffs and low bushes, which make for ideal nesting sites for frigatebirds, Nazca boobies and tropicbirds.

Lobos Island: A panga boat ride along the coastline offers ample opportunity to observe nesting blue-footed boobies, frigatebirds, pelicans and large colonies of sea lion. It's also possible to swim with the curious sea lions here.

ESPAÑOLA

MORNING: Gardner Bay: Bask in the sunshine on pristine sandy white beaches observing large bird colonies, sea lion and Española lava lizards or discover the vibrant underwater world swimming with sea turtles, pufferfish, and Galapagos grunts. Weather permitting, Gardner Bay also boasts exceptional kayaking.

AFTERNOON: Suarez Point: This rocky land offers one of the most beautiful walks in the Galapagos, with plenty of close-up wildlife opportunities with marine iguanas, sea lions and swallow-tailed gulls. It's also the only known breeding site for the critically endangered waved albatross. Keep an eye out for the large blowhole which can spray ocean water up to 15 - 23 m (50 - 75 ft) in the air.

04

Beautiful beaches

FLOREANA

MORNING: Cormorant Point: With only 350 known pairs left in the Galapagos, this is one of the best places to see these vibrant creatures, also known as the pinkest flamingo on earth. Other inhabitants to look for are Floreana lava lizards, finches and flycatchers.

Champion Islet: Underwater, explore one of the best snorkelling sites. Above the surface, ride in a panga boat for your best chance of seeing the endangered Floreana mockingbird.

AFTERNOON: Post Office Bay: In the 18th century, sailors passing through the islands placed a wooden barrel on this island to use as an unofficial mailbox. Known as Post Office Bay today, the tradition continues as travellers leave addressed postcards in the barrel and sort through left mail to deliver at home. The sheltered bay is also a fantastic area to explore in a kayak.







Tortoises and twins

SANTA CRUZ

MORNING: The Highlands: Begin your day at El Chato Ranch Private Reserve, where you'll be able to see the Galapagos giant tortoise. Next, stroll through the Highland's lush forests, where numerous finch varieties can be spotted. If there's enough time, you'll also explore 'Los Gemelos' (Twin Craters), two collapsed calderas surrounded by a distinctive Scalesia forest.

AFTERNOON: Charles Darwin Research Station: See conservation in action at the research station, an active breeding site for giant tortoises. After this, use your free time to explore the town, experiencing the local culture first-hand. This is also the perfect opportunity relax on board the Galapagos Explorer.

Rocky summits

SANTA CRUZ | BARTOLOMÉ

MORNING: Dragon Hill: This rocky, low-lying hill is home to an impressive population of Galapagos land iguana. These miniature dragons roam around the sun-scorched, boulder-strewn island, enjoying the fruits and flowers of their favourite food, the prickly pear. The trail also guides you through other endemic vegetation, like the palo santo tree, letter leaf tree and Galapagos cotton. Along the way, keep an eye out for finches, yellow warblers and flycatchers.

AFTERNOON: Pinnacle Rock: Exactly 375 steps lead you to the summit of an extinct volcano, boasting some of the best views in the Galapagos. Later, enjoy a panga boat ride along the coast in search of the Galapagos penguin and snorkel with parrotfish, Sergeant majors, starfish and stingrays.





07

Birdwatchers' paradise

GENOVESA

MORNING: Darwin Bay: Here you'll find 70 000 pairs of nesting red-footed boobies – the largest colony on earth. Along the walking trail, also look out for swallow-tailed gulls, the only nocturnal gull species in the world. Other notable fauna and flora include sea lions, the yellow-crowned night heron, and the lava morning glory plant. Darwin Bay is also the only place to see the sharp-beaked ground finch. Ocean swims, kayaking and panga boat rides are also available.

AFTERNOON: Prince Philip's Steps: A steep but short climb leads you onto a flat, dried lava field where you can spot colonies of red-footed boobies, Nazca boobies, great frigatebirds and wedge-rumped storm petrels that nest under the rocks. This is also your best chance to glimpse the shy, short-eared owl.

08

Departure

DAPHNE MAJOR

MORNING: Your final sail takes you around Daphne Major, an extinct volcanic tuff cone. Nazca boobies, red-billed tropicbirds, and blue-footed boobies can be found nesting here. Daphne Major is also the primary site of Peter and Rosemary Grant's iconic 40-year study of evolution in Darwin's finches that demonstrates evolution occurring over short periods of time. Nearly all of the finches on the island are banded for observation.

Thereafter, it is time to wave a fond farewell to the Galapagos Explorer as you head to Seymour Airport on Baltra Island for your flight onward.



Arrival

SANTA CRUZ

AFTERNOON: Upon arrival at Seymour Airport on Baltra Island, you will be welcomed and transferred to the Galapagos Explorer.

Black Turtle Cove: Only accessible by panga boat, Black Turtle Cove is a mangrove estuary featuring black, red and brown mangroves. Pristine and naturally secluded, the cove is a haven for rare fauna and flora and has been declared a turtle sanctuary. Pangas are required to turn off their motors while visiting, allowing you to truly become immersed in the sights and sounds of your natural surrounds.

02

Chinese Hat

SANTIAGO | RABIDA

MORNING: Chinese Hat: This island features a gently sloping volcanic cone that emerges from the ocean, resembling the distinctive shape of an old-fashioned Chinese hat. In the west you can see lava formations topped with coral heads, which are an indicator that the flows were once formed under the sea. Look out for bright red Sally Lightfoot crabs, marine iguanas, lava lizards and sea lions. This is also an excellent snorkeling site.

AFTERNOON: Rabida Island:

Celebrated as one of the most colourful and volcanically varied islands in the archipelago, Rabida's famous red sandy beach (the only one in the Galapagos) and stunning lookouts provide unmatched photographic opportunities. The island is also a birdwatcher's delight where some of the region's rarest species are in abundance.

Iconic fauna and flora

SANTIAGO

MORNING: James Bay: Walk along the coastline in search of American oystercatchers, lava herons, great blue herons as well as bright red Sally Lightfoot crabs. Towards the end of the walk, you'll find a beautiful, eroded lava tunnel offering one of the only chances to see the Galapagos fur seal.

AFTERNOON: Espumilla Beach: Enjoy a secluded cove with pristine white sandy beaches, ideal for leisurely walks, swimming, and kayaking.

Buccaneer Cove: Named after the first navigators that used the island as an anchorage place to beach their boats while searching for food or water, today, the cove is home to a variety of marine birds, sea lions and fur seals. Only accessible by panga boat, look out for pelicans, herons, swallow-tailed gulls, and boobies.

04

Pristine ecosystems

FERNANDINA

MORNING: Espinosa Point: This is one of the most untouched islands in the Galapagos. No foreign species have ever invaded Fernandina and the unique landscape was created by lava fields of the volcano La Cumbre. Marine iguanas conglomerate in larger groups than on any other island and this is one of the best chances to see them dive underwater.

AFTERNOON: Tagus Cove: Hike to the top of the cliff to see Darwin Lake, an uplifted ultra-saline lake saltier than the sea. Created from the remains of a tuff cone, Tagus Cove is a secluded bay with calm waters ideal for panga boat rides, kayaking and snorkelling, providing close encounters with the Galapagos penguin and other iconic sea birds, like the flightless cormorant, Galapagos martin, brown noddy, brown pelican and blue-footed booby.

Myriad marine life

ISABELA

MORNING: Elizabeth Bay: Few have the privilege of exploring this secluded bay, teeming with abundant marine life. Cruise by panga boat into the sheltered mangrove lagoon, where the tallest red mangroves in the Galapagos tower overhead and graceful sea turtles swim to the water's surface.

AFTERNOON: Moreno Point: The main attraction of this are the coastal lagoons in the middle of black lava flows where several unique bird species can be found. Walk in the lava flows of Sierra Negra and Cerro Azul, some of the Galapagos' most active volcanoes, and between the island's three cacti species (lava, candelabra, and prickly pear).

Tortoises and twins

SANTA CRUZ

MORNING: The Highlands: Begin your day at El Chato Ranch Private Reserve, where you'll be able to see the Galapagos giant tortoise. Island hopping

SANTA FE | SOUTH PLAZA

MORNING: Santa Fe: A short walking trail leads you to a large colony of sea lion, afterwards taking you inland to spot the island's endemic land iguana and large prickly pear cactus forest. With some luck, you may even see the rice rat unique to the islands.

AFTERNOON: South Plaza: A distinctive landscape of steep cliffs filled with red Sesuvium plants and Opuntia cacti makes for some of the most interesting wildlife observations available in Galapagos. Land iguanas are easily seen from the walking trail under the shade of cactuses waiting for a prickly pear to fall.





Departure

MOSQUERA

MORNING: A small island with white sandy beaches, black lava rocks and turquoise waters, Mosquera Island is the last stop of your Galapagos adventure. Highlights include the island's vibrant colony of Galapagos sea lion, one of the archipelago's largest, and the nesting grounds of the lava gull, the rarest gull species on the planet. Other creatures to look out for include Sally Lightfoot crabs, marine iguanas and pelicans.

Thereafter, it is time to wave a fond farewell to the Galapagos Explorer as you head to Seymour Airport on Baltra Island for your flight onward.
