At *le Café du 19M*, the exhibition *Beyond our Horizons: From Tokyo to Paris* makes its way onto the plate.

At *la Galerie du 19M*, the exhibition *Beyond our Horizons: from Tokyo to Paris* brings together in dialogue French and Japanese craftsmanship: goldsmithing by Maison Goossens and woodwork by sculptor Yoshiki Masuda, embroidery by Atelier Montex and Lesage Intérieurs mounted on wooden and organza partitions by Yukio Fujita, hybrid wigs inspired by the world of the Maisons d'art by the konomad duo. Neither a café nor a bistro, *le Café du 19M* is an open space where this dialogue continues on the plate.

From 29 January to 26 April, the kitchen is being shared by two chefs.

The conversation between France and Japan is reflected in the dishes: a Tokyo-style Margherita pizza with *fior di latte*, shiso leaves, and toasted sesame oil.

There are also miso cookies, *genmaicha* tea, sake, as well as natural wine and Kirin beer. More than a Japanese theme superimposed on a French menu, this is a true exchange between two culinary traditions.

The two chefs, Victor Legrand and Mathieu Canet (ten years at the helm of Le Dauphin), have created a menu that changes each week according to the seasons. During the week, lunch includes pizzas and French cuisine with Japanese accents. On weekends, the format changes with small plates to share izakaya-style, ramen, and pizzas in two different sizes. The whole concept is designed and managed by Grand Cuisine—the agency run by Patricia Meunier and Mat Gallet, which has operated *le Café du 19M* since its inception.

*le Café du 19M* is open Wednesday to Sunday, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Reservations are recommended for lunch (from noon to 2 p.m. on weekdays and until 4 p.m. on weekends).

### Prices

Starters and desserts from 6–10 €.

Main courses and Tokyo-style pizzas from 15–22 €.

Desserts: reimagined Mont Blanc, sesame financier, etc.

Drinks: sake, natural Japanese wine, Japanese beer.

At the coffee shop counter: matcha latte, hojicha latte, Japanese teas, Basque cheesecake, chocolate and miso cookies, take-away onigiri, etc.

# About the exhibition *Beyond our Horizons*

In autumn 2025, *la Galerie du 19M* presented its third international exhibition in Tokyo, on the 52nd floor of the Mori Tower. In this spectacular setting, it provided a unique experience of the *Métiers d'art* by unveiling the *Beyond our Horizons* exhibition for the first time.

After its success in Japan with nearly 75,000 visitors, the exhibition has travelled to Paris to provide the French public with a new experience, driven by the same ambition: to showcase original works, including pieces that are the result of collaborations between Japanese artisans and the French *Maisons d'art* resident at *le19M*. The eleven *Maisons d'art* of *le19M*—Atelier Montex, Desrues, Goossens, Lemarié, Lesage, Lesage Intérieurs, Atelier Lognon, Massaro, Maison Michel, Paloma, and Studio MTX—are at the heart of this exhibition, designed as a space for wonder, surprise, and dialogue. More than thirty French and Japanese artisans and designers are presenting their works and installations, including many new creations produced in collaboration with the *Maisons*. Ten new creators have joined the Paris edition to extend this dialogue even further.

Curated by five creative figures—Momoko Ando, director of Kinema Museum; Yoichi Nishio, editor-in-chief of *Casa BRUTUS*; Shinichiro Ogata, founder and artistic director of SIMPLICITY; Kayo Tokuda, exhibition curator; and Aska Yamashita, artistic director of Atelier Montex—the exhibition revolves around a common theme: how gesture and *savoir-faire*, whether inherited or reimagined, enhance our vision of the world, beyond borders and horizons.
