OUR FIRST CENTURY AND BEYOND

Orchestra Iowa has been a part of the fabric of our communities for over a century, creating meaningful and enduring experiences through the power of symphonic music.

Much has changed since 1923 when the Cedar Rapids Symphony debuted on April 13. What started as a community orchestra of volunteer musicians has grown into a top tier professional symphony. Orchestra Iowa provides an enriching resource to our diverse communities by contributing to Iowa's cultural vibrancy.

1923 The Cedar Rapids Symphony (CRSO) performs its inaugural concert on April 13th, under the baton of Joseph Kitchin.

1928 CRSO performs a season of eight concerts at Veteran's Memorial Coliseum. Tickets were just 75¢ or \$5 for a season subscription.

1939-1945 CRSO continued to play throughout WWII, making it one of the oldest, continuously operating symphonies west of the Mississippi River.

1952 Henry Denecke is appointed Music Director. Musicians and the Maestro are now paid for their services.

1970 Richard Williams becomes Music Director, ushering in a period of rapid expansion: doubling audience size, establishing a string quartet, and commissioning new music.

1976 CRSO holds its first concert at the newly restored Paramount Theatre. The concert features renowned pianist, Van Cliburn.

1981 Following a nationwide search, Christian Tiemeyer is appointed Music Director. The CRSO grows to become one of the largest orchestras in the state, performing eight pairs of concerts along with establishing a new two-concert youth series.

1990 CRSO establishes an endowment fund, helping to assure the continued growth and financial stability of the organization.

2004 CRSO and the Symphony School move into its new operational home at 119 Third Ave, where the organization remains today.

2006 Tiemeyer retires and a nationwide search identifies Timothy Hankewich as Music Director. New partnerships are established with IPR, IPTV, expanding the regional exposure of and participation with the organization.

2008 In June, a devastating 500-year flood destroys the CRSO's school, administrative offices and performance home, the Paramount Theatre.

2008 Maestro Hankewich greets audiences on the front lawn of Brucemore to open the performance season in September. Also unveiled is the organization's new name, Orchestra Iowa, embracing expanding significance of the organization.

2012 In November, following an extensive multimillion-dollar restoration, Orchestra Iowa reopens the Paramount Theatre to a sold-out performance featuring Harry Connick, Jr., his band, and the Orchestra Iowa musicians.

2018 Acclaimed pianist, Emanuel Ax, gifts Orchestra Iowa a week-long residency, concluding with a gala and sold-out performance with the Orchestra.

2020 The COVID pandemic shutters performing venues, including Orchestra Iowa. Maestro Tim and a series of guests take to social media with a weekly Happy Hour, connecting with and entertaining patrons and music lovers around the world.

2020 In August, an inland hurricane (known as a derecho) sweeps through the Cedar Rapids and surrounding communities. The Orchestra's School, library, and Opus Concert Café sustain substantial damage. The community responded through the "Save Our Scores" fundraising campaign to support replacing of important musical scores.

2023 Orchestra Iowa marks 100 years! Celebrations include a formal gala, a new historical video documentary, and a permanent community musical installation, The SoundWave.

2024 Orchestra Iowa kicks off its second century, welcoming a new concertmaster, Julia Sakharova, in February, and a new CEO, Eric Marshall, in July.

Grow the Orchestra Iowa School by attracting and retaining instructors through competitive compensation and ongoing administrative support.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Sponsor fun, hands-on "Pied Piper" mini-concerts in community libraries throughout Eastern Iowa; introduce preschool-aged children to music and instrument families.

MUSIC IN THE SCHOOLS

Expand these informative, interactive performances to 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grade classrooms in area communities to increase understanding of string, brass, and woodwind instruments.

YOUTH CONCERTS

Subsidize the cost of music education concerts in the Paramount Theatre for more than 3,000 students each year.

INSTRUMENT MAINTENANCE

Finance the ongoing maintenance of instruments used for the Fifth Grade Fiddles program across Eastern Iowa.

MUSIC EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Provide a diverse range of music education opportunities for students of all ages and skill levels.



ORCHESTRA IOWA CHORUS

Not every orchestra can boast of its own impressive chorus. Underwrite costs such as choral music, an accompanist, and rehearsals.

OUTSTANDING MUSICIANS

MUSICIAN COMPENSATION

Provide competitive wages and benefits to recruit and retain skilled musicians in all positions, especially leadership roles.

MUSICIAN TRAVEL

Underwrite travel costs for the more than 50% of the Orchestra's musicians who reside in major midwest cities in surrounding states and travel to Cedar Rapids for rehearsals and performances.



INFRASTRUCTURE & OPERATIONS

BUILDING MAINTENANCE

Sustain the Orchestra's historic building, including HVAC maintenance, tuckpointing, and upgrades to electrical and plumbing; maintain Opus Concert Café appliances.

TECHNOLOGY

Support tech improvements and related training; ensure regulatory compliance.

MORTGAGE RETIREMENT

Eliminate debt; apply the savings to program enhancements.

CLIMATE-CONTROLLED INSTRUMENT STORAGE

Create a climate-controlled storage space to care for our valuable instruments and maximize their lifespan.



MUSICIAN CO-WORKING SPACE

Equip the new co-working space for musicians; allowing for remote work between rehearsals.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT

Attract and retain staff with competitive wages, benefits, continuing education, and training.

PRODUCTION EQUIPMENT

Ensure access to modern audio/visual needs, including Opus Concert Café, mobile performance, and recording technologies.
