TIPS & TRICKS

- Learn how to move the camera. If you have a Pan/Tilt/Zoom camera (PTZ) find the remote control and learn how to use it to move the camera around
- Store presets in the camera. Learn to store and recall preset locations
- Focus on faces! Students are always happy to see the person talking to help them learn
- Giving remote to the students to let them move it, focus on things, etc.
- They can see their classmates, teacher, and classroom
- Can aim it at anywhere in the classroom: for presentations, for the board, for the promethean
- Store these key locations as presets
- Gives you the option to Zoom in to papers
- Allows for ability to Zoom in if you RLI and not in your physical classroom
- Moving the camera, either with the tracking or moving it yourself, allows for the students to feel as if they are part of the room
- Select student locations based on who you plan to spotlight on the camera. For instance, move all the participating students to one side of the room so the camera doesn't need to move from one side of the room to another to focus on the students who are participating
- Use breakout rooms to encourage participation in small groups
- Students (and teachers) need to see teacher faces (or student faces) to ensure understanding and to get the non-verbal feedback required
- Ensure the TV shows the remote students, add another TV if needed
