

TIPS & TRICKS

- Get to know your students: Students that feel connected to you, are more likely to be engaged even via long distance.
- Plan ahead. Have a few ideas ready to implement that will encourage remote participant engagement Have a couple extra ideas ready if things aren't working (Have a backup plan)
- Encourage Bell work to be collaborative
- Use an "Exit Ticket" technique where remote students need to be engaged to leave the class
- For student reading use opposite engagement opportunities (In person student reads or answers questions then a remote student reads or answers questions)
- Require a local student to answer a remote student's question and vice versa
- Call on and expect responses from remote learners
- Projects
- Breakout rooms (Mix in person students with remote students)
- Chat options
- Random questions/call ons
- 1 on 1 breakout rooms for conferences or data chats with students.
- Allows for parent teacher conferences in a Covid time period or with schedules
- Students get a bit of down time between classes to catch up with students they haven't seen face to face in a while
- Share screen and share sound allows for them to be engaged as if they were present in class
- Back and Forth: One day the reading is in person people and the questions are the RLI kids
- Backgrounds and silliness
- Polls
- Turning in photos or videos instead of writing
