PROBLEM LIST

- Bite wounds (right ear and oral cavity) - r/o secondary infection, tissue necrosis
- Infected laceration of right lip with possible labial frenulum avulsion - r/o osteomyelitis if not treated, chronic draining tract
- Intact female with history of inter-dog aggression - r/o hormonal influence on behavior

DIAGNOSTICS

COMMUNICATION

Explained that oral wound is infected and swollen, making it a poor surgical candidate currently, the wound appears to no longer be fresh and is infected. Discussed that tissue appears to be avulsed from mandible and will require surgical repair under general anesthesia once infection is controlled. Explained risks of not treating, including potential for osteomyelitis and chronic infection. Discussed immediate need for antibiotics and anti-inflammatory medications. Provided cost estimates with option for generic amoxicillin-clavulanate prescription at human pharmacy for approximately.

Discussed payment options including CareCredit, Scratchpay, and Affirm. Client stated she has no funds currently and cannot afford treatment.

Discussed surrender options at BARCS and possible SpayNow low-cost clinic in Columbia. Stressed without treatment this is going to get worse, pet will likely stop eating.

Client declined all treatment

Client can not cover cost of exam, declines applying for payment options

Discharge Summary

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HOME CARE AND MONITORING

During Raven's examination, it was determined that she has an infected wound on her right ear and a significant infected wound on her left lip. The lip wound is particularly concerning as it appears the tissue has been torn away from the jawbone and shows signs of infection with pus and dead tissue present. The swelling and infection make this a poor candidate for immediate surgery.

As we discussed, Raven needs antibiotics to fight the infection and anti-inflammatory medication for pain and swelling. Once the infection is under control, she will require surgical repair of the lip wound under general anesthesia. Without proper treatment, there's a risk the infection could spread to the bone of the jaw, creating a much more serious and costly problem.

Given that you weren't able to proceed with treatment today, I strongly encourage you find other treatment options for Raven. You also mentioned reaching out to BARCS about possible surrender as you can not care for Raven's wounds.
