Greetings,

Sorry to come to you again to ask if someone can come and clean the trash/garbage behind my house. The first service request was reported on 11-24-2025 and the illegal dumping continues. The service request number is 25-00983207 for HCD-Illegal Dumping. At that time when the first illegal dumping occurred no cameras were installed around my house. Now I am reporting for the 2nd time and this time I have installed four Blink cameras outside my house.

On January 10, 2025 at 6:05pm, the camera caught a person carrying a brown grocery bag dumping trash behind my house. The next day January 11, 2025 at 9:20am the camera captured a person walking close along the wall and standing in the debris of trash to smoke a cigarette and flicked the cigarette ashes in the trash and then flicked the cigarette away.

I think both acts were done intentionally and deliberately; both people wanted to be seen in the camera. The next act was captured on January 14, 2025 at 6:50am; this person is seen carrying a white trash bag and placing it behind my house in the alleyway. I have a corner house. This is the same person captured on camera January 10, 2025. The person is wearing the same outfit and shoes.

I think these two people know each other. The house is presently vacant. My brother lived in the home until he passed away September 1, 2025. Can you give any recommendations on how to proceed in this matter? I got the cameras to catch who has been dumping trash behind my house, now that I've gotten the camera installed it seems as if they're dumping trash deliberately.

This person knows to walk in the blind spot of the camera so the sensor won't pick them up and knows how to walk away so they won't get detected by the sensor because she immediately disappears from the camera. But she made a mistake; on one of the videos she walked into the blind spot of the camera to place the bag of trash there, but then she shifts and walked to the opposite side of the alley to place the white trash bag down and she moved away from the blind spot and the sensor picked up her body motion. There is also an ATE camera on the corner of Rutland/Lanvale.
