ASSESSMENT

Decompensated Brachycephalic Airway Syndrome

PLAN

Placed into oxygen at presentation

Spoke with owner, advised Fly is in severe distress and overheating, likely secondary to a poor airway that has decompensated. Strongly recommend IV catheter, anesthetize and intubate, workup and stabilize here before transfer to a 24 hour hospital for continued care. Owner expresses financial concerns, advised if cannot do aggressive treatment should PTS. Owner declines and elects to take Fly home AMA

DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS

Fly was seen for onset of difficulty breathing after a walk today. He presented in severe respiratory distress, which we suspect is secondary to decompensation of his genetic airway disease from the walk. He has a very elevated temperature and is likely experiencing heat stroke secondary to his breathing trouble. He has responded some to oxygen therapy but he needs more aggressive treatment and testing to get him through this crisis. You have elected to take him home against medical advice. Please seek additional care for Fly ASAP as there is a real risk of him dying from suffocation or heat stroke.
