Tips to help make your pet's visit fear free:

*Avoid giving your pet a meal within 2 hours of your visit unless they have a medical condition requiring such as we do use treats as rewards during their visit.

*Let us know if you, your pet, or anyone in your household have any food allergies (cheese, peanut butter, animal proteins) so that we can avoid giving them treats that may trigger a reaction.

*If you are aware of any areas your pet does not like being handled around or limitations they have please give us a heads up so that we can do our best to accommodate. Bring a favorite toy or blanket with you to your pet's vet visit as a comfort item.

*Give yourself plenty of time to make it to your appointment, your pet can feel your stress so if you are rushing they are likely to pick up on your anxiety.

*Make sure your equipment is in good working order and appropriate for a trip to the vet: avoid retractable leashes, collars/harnesses that your pet can get out of, and make sure that your cat or dog is in a sturdy and size appropriate carrier.

NOSE TO TAIL EXAM

Our doctors will perform a thorough nose-to-tail physical exam



INTESTINAL PARASITE SCREEN

We will screen for intestinal parasites on all pets. Many of these parasites carry a zoonotic risk.



HEARTWORM TICK SCREENING DOGS ONLY

We will screen for heartworm disease. Heartworms are spread by mosquitos.



BLOOD PANEL "INTERNAL EXAM"

ALL of our doctors recommend an annual blood screen as a part of your pet's annual visit. This will help us establish annual baselines we can trend, and also help us detect early onset of disease processes!



HEARTWORM AND FLEA- TICK PREVENTION

Ortho, Bandage, Splint Care Discharge Instructions

x Your pet had a general anesthetic or was sedated today. This may cause your pet to be tired and uninterested in playing or eating this evening. Generally, recovery is uneventful and your pet's attitude and appetite will soon return to normal. Please keep your pet in a safe area where they will not fall off furniture or down stairs. If your pet continues to be lethargic or is hiding after 36 hours please call us.

Home Care Instructions: *Please see instructions below for additional information about how to treat your pet when you return home.*

Exercise Restrictions:

- Leash walk
- Cage Rest
- No running/jumping/climbing until further notice.

Feeding:

- Withhold food and water for 1 to 2 hours. Start with a small amount of water, and then one to two hours later, give half a normal meal. You can begin normal feeding in the morning.

Bandage Care:

- Your pet has a small wrap on its leg from where the catheter was placed. It can be removed in 1 - 2 hours. Your pet has an IV catheter in its leg. Please ensure your pet does not chew it out overnight.
- Your pet has a bandage/splint placed.
 - Keep the bandage clean and dry. Wrap the bandage with a plastic bag or place saran wrap over the bandage when your pet is taken outside to keep it clean and dry, then remove it as soon as you come inside.
 - Leaving additional wrap/tape/rubber bands or other material on or over the bandage may cause the bandage to tighten and cut the blood supply off to the toes. This could result in severe wounds to that foot or leg that could require amputation of the foot.
 - Have the bandage changed immediately if it becomes wet, has drainage, or develops a foul odor.
 - Please watch for swelling of toes. Please compare the toes in the bandage with the toes of the other feet. Also, evaluate the toes to be sure they are warm. If the toes swell, it impedes blood flow to the area and if left untreated will cause substantial problems. If this occurs, call immediately.
 - The bandage/splint should not slip or cause redness or sores on the skin. The upper aspect of the leg is wide and narrows towards the toes. This makes keeping a bandage in place difficult at times. If it slips down or shifts in any way, please contact us.
 - If the patient removes it prematurely, please call our office immediately.
 - Buster collars or Bitter solutions are available to discourage licking and chewing.
- The bandage should be changed in 7 days by a veterinarian or trained staff member. Please call ahead for an appointment. Please schedule bandage changes as directed by the doctor. There is no charge for bandage removal, however if it is necessary to replace the bandage, standard fees will be charged.

Prescriptions: *Please give medications according to the following directions. If there is excessive vomiting, diarrhea, or if your pet will not take this medication, please call us immediately.*

tto- discussed with owner severity of pt injuries, ideally pt goes to the ER for cont care/surgery. discussed with surgeon at ER - tibial fractures can be repaired with plates, concern for R tarsal fracture which can create more uncertainty about long term prognosis. discussed surgeon recommendation with owner - cost about \$10-14k. o would need to tell surgeon by tomorrow if they would be able to move forward with surgery on Monday. otherwise, if owner is severely cost limited - discussed splinting as an alternative - clearly not the best option but pt may respond well. would need to plan for minimum of 4 weeks of splinting - tarsal issue may be still a long term complicating factor - frozen joint, chronic arthritis etc.

if owner is not able to afford specialist, they will let us know. RG may be willing to do tibial plates but tarsal fracture still the complicating factor.
