Reason for today's visit: RH limb injury

Background Information: Oreo, a female spayed Domestic Short Hair cat, presented through the ER on 07/19/2026 for an acute RH limb injury. Per history, the injury occurred today when the owner's nephew was playing with her; Oreo screamed and was then found with the right back leg dangling. Owner denies a fall from a recliner or similar furniture. Suspected cause is trauma related to play with the nephew.

Last normal: Patient was last normal earlier today prior to the injury.

Problems and Differentials:

- Right pelvic limb injury - r/o fracture, hip luxation, other.

Initial Communication:

Initial impression: acute right pelvic limb injury sustained with the right back leg abnormally position with moved during examination; clinically concerned for fracture versus hip luxation pending imaging to characterize severity. Discussed sedated radiographs to evaluate the right pelvic limb given high suspicion for fracture or possible hip luxation; sedation was required because the limb is very painful and complete immobility is required for diagnostic positioning.

Reviewed costs: for the exam and sedated x-rays, with and without radiologist review. Explained that radiologist review of radiographs could help determine whether the injury appears surgical or if the limb may be too damaged and might require amputation. We discussed payment options including CareCredit, ScratchPay, and Affirm. Methadone was administered for pain control prior to full evaluation. Owner would like sedated x-rays without radiologist review. Has family memeber in veterinarian field, is going to review payment options.

Diagnostics:

- None

Treatment Plan/Medication:

- Methadone IM

Secondary family member arrived while owner was looking into payment options:

Explained concerns that pet has a fracture or dislocation of RH leg, but can not complete full palpation due to pain; pet

has already had a methadone injection, she will need sedation for xrays,
I was told that the owner wasn't authorized to spend that kind of money and that they weren't going to pay for any x-rays.
Recommend looking into options such as Care Credit, Scratch Pay and Affirm. The owner told secondary family member that this happened because his kid was playing with his cat, and that the cat needed xrays.
Gave family members time to discuss

Secondary family member came to the CEC state and told Jessie that they weren't going to do the xrays or the exam -
Jessie tried to explain that the DR already performed an exam and the pet already had a pain medication injection - again
secondary owner said they were not paying and wanted to take the cat and leave

I told the family that they would be leaving against medical advised as I had concerns that pet was in pain, stated we
could send home pain medication and they could try to follow-up with pDVM. Again they stated they weren't paying for
anything and they wanted to leave.

Advised that could leave AMA
