

On July 22, 2026, at 1015am, Supervisors Howard and Novak, AEOs Thomas, McCoon and Hughes along with multiple Deputies from the Baltimore City Sheriff's Department arrived at the location to execute an Administrative Search and Seizure Warrant. The front door of the store was unlocked and Officers announced themselves while entering. Store owner, Cristian Rodriguez Morales was inside along with a female individual and two children. Officers informed Mr. Morales of the warrant and that all animals at the location would be removed. Mr. Morales was handed the warrant and allowed Officers to begin the documentation and removal process. The store contained 321 birds of various species and colors. The birds were housed in cages that ranged in style and size. The description of the animals and their housing are as follows:

Below is a detailed description of the location of the birds, the environment in which they were kept, and the condition of the birds after medical evaluation.

Cage banks on the left side of the front section of the store contained the following birds -

- Cage L-A-1 was a black wire cage that housed five Quaker Parrots (183406-183410). The cage contained a separator forcing all five birds to remain on the right side of the cage resulting in overcrowding.
- Cage L-A-2 was a purple wire cage that housed 12 Parakeets (183229-183240).
 - Bird 183229 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
 - Bird 183231 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
 - Bird 183234 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
 - Bird 183240 was underweight, BCS 3/9 and had decreased musculing over its keel.
- Cage L-A-3 was a black wire cage that housed eleven Budgies (183430-183440).
 - Bird 183431 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with decreased musculing over its keel.
 - Bird 183439 had severely damaged primary and tail feathers.
- Cage L-A-4 was a white wire cage that housed 10 Budgies (183211-183220).
- Cage L-B-1 was a white metal cage that housed three Sun Conures (183411-183413).
 - Bird 183412 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with decreased musculing over its keel.
- Cage L-B-2 was a white metal cage that housed four Sun Conures (183272-183275).
- Cage L-B-3 was a white metal cage that housed two Quaker Parrots (183266-183267).
- Cage L-B-4 was a white metal cage that housed three Quaker Parrots (183255-183257).

- Bird 183255 had ragged tail feathers.
 - Bird 183257 had ragged tail feathers.
- Cage L-B-5 was a white metal cage that housed four Green Cheek Conures (183258-183261).
 - Bird 183259 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
- Cage L-B-6 was a white metal cage that housed three Conures (183377-183379).
 - Bird 183377 had a traumatic injury to the left wrist.
- Cage L-B-7 was a white metal cage that housed four Conures (183262-183265).
- Cage L-B-8 was a white metal cage that housed four Conures (183221-183224).
- Cage L-B-9 was a white metal cage that housed four Conures (183391-183394).
 - Bird 183392 was missing feathers on its right wing.
 - Bird 183394 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
- Cage L-B-10 was a white metal cage that housed four Conures (183373-183376).
- Cage L-B-11 was a white metal cage that housed eleven Budgies (183473-183483).
 - Bird 183473 was emaciated, BCS 2/9.
- Cage L-C-1 was a white metal cage that housed six Conures (183397-183402).
 - Bird 183397 was missing feathers on the back of its head.
 - Bird 183398 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
 - Bird 183401 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
 - Bird 183402 was emaciated, BCS 2/9, dehydrated and had damaged feathers on the back of its head.
- Cage L-C-2 was a white metal cage that housed three Quaker Parrots (183420-183422).
 - Bird 183422 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with decreased musculing over its keel and had damaged tail feathers.
- Cage L-C-3 was a white metal cage that housed four Quaker Parrots (183268-183271).
 - Bird 183268 had tail feathers that were torn at the ends.
 - Bird 183269 had a mildly damaged tail.
- Cage L-C-4 was a white metal cage that housed four Half Moon Conures (183423-183426).
 - Bird 183423 was emaciated, BCS 2/9.
 - Bird 183425 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
 - Bird 183426 was emaciated, BCS 2/9, with damaged primary and tail feathers. Fluids administered.
- Cage L-C-5 was a white metal cage that housed four Conures (183306-183309).
 - Bird 183306 was underweight, BCS 3/9, dehydrated and had feather damage.

- Bird 183307 was emaciated, BCS 2/9, dehydrated and had tail feather damage.
 - Bird 183308 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
- Cage L-C-6 was a white metal cage that housed four Conures (183416-183419).
 - Bird 183417 appeared quiet and required fluids to be administered.
- Cage L-C-7 was a white metal cage that housed four Conures (183310-183313).
 - Bird 183312 was missing tail feathers, and the remaining feathers were damaged.
 - Bird 183313 was underweight, BCS 3/9 and had decreased muscling over its keel.
- Cage L-C-8 was a white metal cage that housed ten Budgies (183294-183303).
- Cage L-C-9 was a white metal cage that housed eleven birds (183349-183359).
 - Bird 183349 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with decreased muscling over its keel and feather loss around keel.
 - Bird 183352 was euthanized due to having a decreased respiratory effort and rate, being underweight, BCS 3/9 with decreased muscling over its keel, being dehydrated, missing tail and primary feathers and both eyes having blepharospasms.
 - Bird 183353 was euthanized due to having a complex fracture of its right leg.
 - Bird 183354 had barbered primary feathers and missing feathers around its cloaca.
 - Bird 183356 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with decreased muscling over its keel.
 - Bird 183357 had moisture around its cloaca and was borderline lethargic which required fluids be administered.
 - 183358 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with decreased muscling over its keel, was dehydrated and borderline lethargic which required fluids to be administered.
- Cage L-D-1 was a white metal cage that housed one Green Cheek Conure (183448).
- Cage L-D-2 was a white metal cage that housed three Cockatiels (183249-183251).
 - Bird 183251 was missing all tail feathers.
- Cage L-D-3 was a white metal cage that housed three Conures (183246—183248).
 - Bird 183246 had damaged tail feathers and was missing feathers on its head.
 - Bird 183248 was underweight, BCS 3/9 and had feather damage on both wings.
- Cage L-D-4 was a white metal cage that housed two Budgies (183285-183286).
- Cage L-D-5 was a white metal cage that housed three Conures (183427-183429).

- Bird 183428 was quiet and lethargic which required fluids to be administered.
- Bird 183429 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with damaged tail feathers.
- Cage L-D-6 was a white metal cage that housed two Conures (183380-183381).
 - Bird 183381 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with decreased musculing over its keel.
- Cage L-D-7 was a white metal cage that housed ten Parakeets (183201-183210).
 - Bird 183201 was euthanized due to the severity of its respiratory distress, illness and condition.
 - Bird 183204 was given fluids and had a chest wound.
- Cage L-D-8 was a white metal cage that housed nine Budgies (183484-183492).
 - Bird 183486 was euthanized due to the overall poor condition of the bird.

Cage banks on the right side of the front section of the store –

- Cage R-A-1 was a white metal cage that housed four Love Birds (183369-183372).
 - Bird 183371 had a superficial wound on its right leg.
 - Bird 183372 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
- Cage R-A-2 was a white metal cage that housed two Lorikeets (183337-183338).
 - Bird 183337 was emaciated, BCS 2/9 with markedly decreased musculing over its keel.
 - Bird 183338 was emaciated, BCS 2/9 with markedly decreased musculing over its keel.
- Cage R-A-3 was a white metal cage that housed three Nanday Conures (183327-183329).
- Cage R-A-4 was a white metal cage that housed two Sun Conures (183441-183442).
 - Bird 183441 had trimmed left wing primary feathers with dried blood.
- Cage R-A-5 was a white metal cage that housed four Cockatiels (183344-183347).
- Cage R-A-6 was a white metal cage that housed three Cockatiels (183443-183445).
- Cage R-A-7 was a white metal cage that housed eight Love Birds (183361-183368).
 - Bird 183363 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with decreased musculing over its keel.
- Cage R-B-1 was a white metal cage that housed four Love Birds (183319-183322).
- Cage R-B-2 was a white metal cage that housed three Conures (183241-183243).
 - Bird 183241 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
 - Bird 183243 was missing the second digit on its right foot, had a raggedy tail, was missing two primary wing feathers and had no secondary feathers on wings.

- Cage R-B-3 was a white metal cage that housed two Quaker Parrots (183387-183388).
 - Bird 183387 had hyperkeratotic extension of keratin on left pom and damage to tail feathers.
 - Bird 183388 had dried blood on the primary feathers of its right wing, likely due to a healed injury.
- Cage R-B-4 was a white metal cage that housed two Quaker Parrots (183414-183415).
 - Bird 183414 had a malformed beak, had missing feathers, bloody skin and required fluids be administered.
- Cage R-B-5 was a white metal cage that housed two Budgies (183287-183288).
- Cage R-B-6 was a white metal cage that housed one Quaker Parrot (183348).
- Cage R-B-7 was a white metal cage that housed four Love Birds (183323-183326).
 - Bird 183326 was underweight, BCS 3/9 and missing toes.
- Cage R-B-8 was a white metal cage that housed seven Love Birds (183330-183336).
 - Bird 183330 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with symmetrical feather damage.
 - Bird 183332 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with bilateral upper primary feather damage.
 - Bird 183333 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
 - Bird 183335 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
- Cage R-C-1 was a white metal cage that housed five Canaries (183339-183343).
 - Bird 183339 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with keratin flaking on its gnathotheca.
- Cage R-C-2 was a white metal cage that housed two Budgies (183304-183305).
- Cage R-C-3 was a white metal cage that housed two Budgies (183292-183293).
- Cage R-C-4 was a white metal cage that housed two Love Birds (183395-183396).
 - Bird 183396 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
- Cage R-C-5 was a white metal cage that housed two Rosie Bourke Parakeets (183314-183315).
 - Bird 183315 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with decreased musculing over its keel.
- Cage R-C-6 was a white metal cage that housed three Cockatiels (183384-183386).
- Cage R-C-7 was a white metal cage that housed one Quaker Parrot (183360).
- Cage R-C-8 was a white metal cage that housed three Budgies (183289-183290).
 - Bird 183289 was euthanized due to severity of its injured wings and tail and illness in vent.

The center of the front section of the store –

- Cage C-1 was a large metal bird cage that housed one Hyacinth Macaw (183254).
 - This bird was emaciated, BCS 2/9.
- Cage C-2 was a large metal bird cage that housed three African Greys (183316-183318).
 - Bird 183318 was emaciated, BCS 2/9.

In the front desk area –

- Cage S-1 was a large white metal bird cage that housed ten Zebra Finches (183463-183472).

In the middle section of the store –

- Cage S-2 was a large beige metal bird cage that housed two Toucans (183244-183245).
 - Bird 183244 had ragged tail feather damage.
 - Bird 183245 had ragged tail feather damage.
- Cage S-3 was a large black metal bird cage that housed five Budgies (183458-183462).
- Cage S-5-U was a white wire cage that housed two Quaker Parrots (183252-183253).
- Cage S-6-L was a large black wire cage that housed three Amazons (183403-183405).
 - Bird 183404 had feather damage and was missing its primary tail feathers.
 - Bird 183405 was missing primary feathers.
- Cage S-7-U was a white wire cage that housed eleven Budgies (183519-183529). This cage was one (top) of three stacked on top of one another and zip-tied together.
 - Bird 183522 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
 - Bird 183525 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
- Cage S-8-M was a white wire cage that housed ten Budgies (183501-183510). This cage was two (middle) of three stacked on top of one another and zip-tied together.
 - Bird 183504 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
 - Bird 183509 was underweight, BCS 3/9 and a dirty vent.
 - Bird 183510 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
- Cage S-9-L was a white wire cage that housed eight Budgies (183511-183518). This cage was three (bottom) of three stacked on top of one another and zip-tied together.
- Cage S-10 was a large white wire cage that housed nine Parakeets (183276-183284).
 - Bird 183276 was underweight, BCS 3/9 and had a dirty vent.

- Cage S-11-U was a black wire cage that housed four Quaker Parrots (183225-183228). This cage was one (top) of three stacked on top of one another and zip-tied together.
 - Bird 183225 was underweight, BCS 3/9, underconditioned and had decreased musculature over its keel.
 - Bird 183226 had damaged tail feathers.
 - Bird 183228 had damaged tail feathers.
- Cage S-12-M was a black wire cage that housed two Quaker Parrots (183389-183390). This cage was two (middle) of three stacked on top of one another and zip-tied together.
 - Bird 183390 was underweight, BCS 3/9.
- Cage S-13-L was a black wire cage that housed two Orange Fronted Conures (183499-183500). This cage was three (bottom) of three stacked on top of one another and zip-tied together.
- Cage S-14 was a large green metal cage that housed nine Budgies (183449-183457).
 - Bird 183449 was underweight, BCS 3/9 with a poor body condition.
- Cage S-15 was a large black wire cage that housed two Love Birds (183382-183383).

A hatch door was in the floor which led to the basement. Officers observed multiple live animal shipping crates and additional cages in the basement. A description of the shipping crates is as follows:

- BWI Yancy (006-81396545) This was a three-piece package shipped from San Diego to BWI on 6/30/26 by Jendy Hernandez. 44.0 lbs.
- MIA-BWI (006-80568736) This was a single package shipped from Miami to BWI on 05/01/2026 by Jendy Yancy Hernandez. 14.0 lbs.
- BWI Jendy Hernandez (006-80761343) This was a single package from San Diego to BWI on 6/12/2026 By Jendy Hernandez. 15.0 lbs.
- Yendy Yancy BWI (006-81018151) This was a three-piece package from San Diego shipped on 05/22/2026 by Jendy H. 50.0 lbs.
- BWI (006-80592702) (12 Indian Ring necks) This was a single package shipped from San Diego to BWI on 06/09/2026 by Jendy Yancy Hernandez. 16.0 lbs.
- BWI (006-80546395) (30 live birds) This was a two-piece package shipped from San Diego to BWI on 03/20/2026 by Jendy Hernandez. 39.0 lbs.

Packages inside of the store had shipping labels addressed to Cristian at 7700 Victory Avenue, Parkville, MD 21234.

Officers asked Mr. Morales to provide required state and local documents for each bird which he could not produce. A State of Maryland Traders License for 040 units, Permit Number 30384846, was present but expired on April 30, 2026.

While conducting the removal process an excessive amount of roaches were observed indicating an infestation. All birds were impounded. A copy of the warrant, a Notice of Impoundment and a property list were left on the front desk. Mr. Morales and an unidentified female were thoroughly explained the redemption process.
