## APPLICATION PROCESS

- Submit application to PHORCAS at [www.ashp.org/phorcas](http://www.ashp.org/phorcas)
- Apply only to one track either the PGY1 or the PGY1-pediatric emphasis
- Application deadline: January 6th
- Wolfson Children's Hospital/Baptist Health ASHP Match Numbers (**apply to ONE track only**)
  - PGY1: 125421
  - PGY1 emphasis in Pediatrics: 125413

### PHORCAS application

- Personal statement/letter of intent
- Current curriculum vitae
- Three references
  - Two of which should be from clinical pharmacy practitioners who have worked directly with the applicant
  - Complete PHORCAS reference including comments
- Transcripts

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## RESIDENCY SPECIFICS

**Duration:** 12 months

### Rotations

- 1 month in length
- 1 month orientation
- 6 required and 4 electives (PGY1) or
- 7 required and 3 electives (PGY1 with pediatric emphasis)
- November/December combined extended experience

**Number of Positions:** 3 for PGY1 and 3 for PGY1 with a pediatric emphasis

**Application Deadline:** January 6th

Completed application must be received by this date

**Start Date:** June 17 or June 24

**Stipend:** \$47,840

**Interview Required:** Yes

### Staffing

- One evening per week and every third weekend
- One major and two minor holidays

### Qualifications/Licensure

- Applicants must possess the Doctor of Pharmacy Degree from an ACPE-accredited program.
- Applicants should be eligible for licensure in the state of Florida and exams taken prior to the beginning of the residency program.
- Applicants are required to participate in the ASHP Matching Program.
