





According to the American Cancer Society, breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death and the second most common type of cancer among women in the U.S. The greatest risk factor in developing breast cancer is age.





Breast cancer incidence rates have increased drastically in Putnam and St. Johns Counties. Only Nassau County has a rate below the state level of 21 per 100,000. 34% of women delayed obtaining a mammogram.

Mammography

The Healthy People 2020 national health targets focus on reducing the female death rate from breast cancer to 20.7 deaths per 100,000 females, and increase to 81.1% the proportion of women who receive breast cancer screening based on recent guidelines.

Programs:

Health education
Community outreach and prevention awareness events
Strategic investments

Strategies:

- Provide community education on early detection of breast cancer and breast health for high-risk women.
- Provide breast health information literature at community health fairs and other community health events.

Program Results:

FY13

- 75 people received information on breast cancer and breast health at a health fair
- 8 people received screening mammograms

FY14

- 81 people attended breast health education sessions
- 400 people received information on breast cancer and breast health at an American Cancer Society breast health awareness walk
- 90 people received breast health information literature at a community health event

FY15

- 75 people attended breast health education sessions and received breast health information literature
- 100 mammography packets were distributed to congregational members and surrounding communities of the Faith-Based Partnership Program

Strategic Investments:

FY13

- The Way Free Medical Clinic received a Strategic Investment grant to provide primary health care services including mammography screenings to 50 women

FY14

- The Way Free Medical Clinic received a Strategic Investment grant to provide primary health care services, including mammography screenings for women

FY15

- The Way Free Medical Clinic received a Strategic Investment grant to provide primary health care services, including mammography screenings for 140 women, treatment for 150 women and educated 150 women
