IMPORTANT

Cork is a natural, renewable product originating from the bark of the cork oak. In nature, cork shows colour variations and naturally formed layers that can split. These characteristics are present in the wallcovering, adding to its natural charm. If installed with care, using a rubber roller (not a brush nor a plastic pallet!), loose corners/edges will remain limited and even hardly visible. If however you don't like these irregularities, you may glue loose parts onto the backing with a little bit of non-staining cellulose adhesive. If you wish, you may then apply a layer of waterbased, matt acrylic varnish on the whole surface of the wallcovering. Please note that the varnish may have a slight influence on the colour of the product of your choice (it might become slightly darker).

Cork is harvested manually, no machinery is used in the harvesting process. The production of cork wallcoverings is a delicate and labour intensive process. Cork is cut into squares which are laminated onto a backing. They are then polished in order to obtain a smooth surface, suitable for printing. Because of the many production steps, it is possible that the backing of the wallcovering gets damaged in certain areas. If so, the damage is repaired by applying adhesive strips. These are thin strips that will not show after the installation of the wallcovering.
