Policy

Barth Syndrome UK (BS UK) respects the right of copyright owners to protection of their original work from unauthorised copying or use.

Guidance

Authors, photographers, artists, software developers, composers and musicians generally have legal rights to prevent others copying their original work without permission. Rights may have been in part or wholly assigned to their employer, publisher or recording company. If, in your volunteering role, you are involved in creating publications, citing medical articles or using any logos, including the BS UK logo, care is needed when copying or reproducing written material, photographs or playing music in public to ensure copyright is not infringed.

Often copyright holders will grant permission where there is no financial gain and they are acknowledged on the reproduction. Also, 10% of a work can often be copied without permission for private research.

By international agreement, copyright protection exists in many countries although requirements can vary considerably. Use of © is not necessary in the United Kingdom to confer protection but is recommended for use on all BS UK original material.

Any publication destined for general or public distribution which includes the BS UK logo must first be approved by BS UK.
