

Build On Our Foundation: Caring for God's Place

The retreat house is splendid in each season. An extraordinary white blanket of snow glistens upon the grounds and rooftops at Bellarmine. If you have not yet made a retreat or Advent Day of Prayer, I would certainly recommend it for next year. The house is especially beautiful when decorated for Christmas. I was moved by an Advent-time retreatant that commented, "Thank you for honoring God by how you care for His place."

As a team we do honor this sacred space, considering this house holy and caring for it as such. Bellarmine is one of the few places left in the world where you can find quiet

and be invited into prayer. Jesus modeled this for us. He needed the quiet to hear the Father's voice; so too do we. In Scripture we read that He stepped back from His daily routine to rest, reflect, and listen. Bellarmine provides the quiet and an experience of the *Spiritual Exercises* that for so many is transformational. Showing the way to God through the *Spiritual Exercises* is central to the work of the Jesuits, illuminating the reality that we are men and women for others, that Christ is calling us to be united in

His name and to care for His Kingdom.

As part of our care for Bellarmine and its mission, in April we will close for five months in order to rebuild the infrastructure of the original 1920s manor home. I ask for your prayers for the success of this critical and extensive project, which is the result of many years of research and planning. We are launching a \$6.2M Capital Campaign, Build on Our Foundation. We are very grateful that our Board of Directors and a few generous benefactors have already pledged commitments to this special effort. We need considerable help to preserve and protect this holy and sacred place. Soon we will be sending a mailing encouraging financial support from all of our weekend

retreatants. We are repeatedly told of the blessings Bellarmine retreats provide, so we will ask for a monetary blessing toward this project as an expression of gratitude and thanksgiving. We pray many will prioritize Bellarmine as they consider their charitable giving.

I invite you now to revisit the grace of retreat and recall your most recent visit to Bellarmine... the turn up the driveway, entering through the red front door, the welcome of the Jesuits, the hospitality of the staff, the quiet, entering the Sacred Heart Chapel, the prayer journey... What stands out to you? I invite you to take a few moments to ponder it. Together we will ensure the future of this important ministry.

The Jesuits converted the manor home to a retreat house in 1947. The home is beautiful; however, the plumbing is failing, and heating systems need to be modernized. Once we rebuild the systems behind the walls and add sprinklers and air conditioning, we will revitalize the in-room retreatant experience. The size of each guest room will remain nearly the same, but we have redesigned the room layouts with a focus on an invitation to prayer. The rooms will be simple and comfortable with a serene color palette, encouraging contemplation. Each room will include a comfortable chair positioned near the window and new furniture and furnishings that are functional and attractive. Samples of the design selections are on display in the front hallway of the retreat house.
