What do I do as a Captain?



Come on retreat yearly and invite friends to come with you!

Most captains come to Bellarmine at least once a year and will often recruit people to come that same weekend. Usually this recruiting will happen in men's clubs, bible studies, family gatherings, etc. However, increasingly captains are finding that friends and acquaintances are interested in a particular retreat or theme and it's hard

to get everyone to agree on one weekend—that's okay, too. The Holy Spirit invites us all to various things. Therefore, Captains may choose to come on one or more weekends, but may also invite people to register for a weekend when you won't be able to attend.



Be familiar with our retreat schedule so you can invite people to programs and retreats that may interest them.

For instance, you may know of veterans, folks in 12-Step recovery, yogis, or writers that want to attend a unique retreat.



Bellarmine's Programming

Bellarmine began as a ministry primarily focused on Ignatian, silent weekend retreats for men. Today, we serve the spiritual needs of men and women of faith. Our ministry offerings include:



Ignatian, Silent Weekend Retreats

Many of our weekend retreats are single-gender. We offer several co-ed retreats, too.

Bill W 12-Step Retreats

Several single-gender retreats each season are dedicated to supporting the recovery of men and women in 12-step programs.

Summer Individually Directed Retreats

These retreats last between five and eight days. We offer the opportunity to meet with a spiritual director daily, participate in the celebration of the Eucharist, worship in adoration, enjoy the serenity of our property, and spend time in silent prayer and reflection.

Semi-Silent Retreats

The environment of a semi-silent retreat will be quiet and contemplative with an opportunity to connect with others over conversation at meals and/or in small group sharing.

A semi-silent retreat includes several presentations, daily Mass, communal prayer, optional small group sharing, delicious meals, a one-on-one conversation with a spiritual director, and many other opportunities to explore the retreat house and grounds. Come to the quiet to read, sleep, pray, and reflect. All activities are optional.

You can talk, just not too much!



Personal Retreats

Personal retreats invite one to experience time alone with God amidst the prayerful silence for a day or overnight stay. We can arrange for retreatants to meet with a confessor or spiritual director if desired and schedules permit.

Bellarmine has two libraries, a resource center, two chapels, and many other common areas. Outdoor spaces include various walking trails, various prayer gardens, a gazebo, a labyrinth, stations of the cross, as well as a few patios and outdoor chairs and benches. The availability of personal retreats is limited. Please call our office to check availability.

Spirituality Programs

We continue to add to our offerings of day, evening, and afternoon themed spirituality programs.

"Coming Home" Retreats for Veterans and Families

Fr. Michael Sparough, SJ and a team of veterans lead a day-long retreat for men and women to pray and reflect on their military experiences in a safe environment.

Regular Spiritual Direction with a Priest or Lay Director

Meet with a Jesuit staff member or Jesuit-trained lay spiritual director for ongoing support in your spiritual life.

Special Groups

Discipleship



St. Ignatius reminds us that we need others to accompany us on our spiritual journey; we cannot walk it alone. The Bellarmine team is committed to accompanying you on your journey as a retreatant and Captain.

Inviting others to attend a retreat can sometimes be challenging. You may hear "no" from the same individual multiple times before he or she decides to come to Bellarmine. We are

here to encourage, support, and affirm your efforts. Please feel free to call or email the Bellarmine staff anytime with concerns, questions, or needs. We have a designated staff member, our Retreat Coordinator, to support you in your role.

Annual Captains' Meeting



Each spring, Bellarmine offers Retreat Captains the opportunity to gather for a day of prayer, reflection, and sharing. At the annual Captains' Meeting, you will hear from Bellarmine staff members and fellow Captains as we reflect on the graces of the previous year and share new developments for the upcoming retreat season. Your attendance enriches our community and bolsters your recruiting efforts.

Personal Invitation to Those in Your Community



In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus challenges us to "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations" (Mt. 28:19). Invite many, and do not be discouraged if it takes several invitations before someone feels called to make a retreat. Ignatian Spirituality emphasizes being a "contemplative in action". Prayerfully discern those

individuals in your parish, workplace, social circles, and family who might benefit from a retreat, and put that into action in the form of a personal invitation.

When and how do I do this?

The Flow of a Captain's Work

Each Spring, usually in April, we publish the schedule for the retreat season starting in September.

- Pick your weekend and ask your group for thoughts on possible retreat dates.
- Tell Bellarmine which weekend you are selecting for your group (by mid-June).
- Inform your network which weekend you have selected and encourage them to save the date and register to save a spot.
- If you want personalized ads, inform Bellarmine (in July—sooner if your retreat is in the fall).
- Send Parish Bulletin Editors ads at least three months before your retreat and ask that the ad run at least four times.
- 6 Check the Captain's portal two months in advance to learn who has registered from your group so you can send reminders.
- 7 Follow up with those that aren't registered yet (phone calls and text messages help).

In preparation for retreat, I will:

- · Pray about whom to invite to Bellarmine
- · Personally invite many to the quiet of a retreat
- · Maintain frequent communication with my retreat group and Bellarmine
- Use Bellarmine's materials to follow-up with invitations and spread the word
- Work to raise awareness of and attendance at Bellarmine
- Read the Captains' Handbook and annual Program Guide to inform myself of the breadth of Bellarmine's offerings

On retreat, I will:

- Welcome all retreatants, especially those who are new to Bellarmine
- Help to ensure volunteer roles are filled for Mass, Stations of the Cross, and the rosary
- · Act as a role model of prayerful silence
- Pray for all those on retreat with me

After retreat, I will:

- Consider the individuals who made retreat with me and pray about who may serve as a Co-Captain to broaden my reach and help build attendance
- · Continue to pray for those who attended the retreat with me
- If it is time for me to retire from my role as a Captain, I will pray about who may serve as my successor
