The Committee's responsibilities will remain the same. That is to provide a well equipped, well maintained, and well supplied kitchen for the congregation. The kitchen facilities are available to any group within the church. To schedule an event just check the church calendar with the church secretary.

Paper products for a particular event should be supplied by the sponsoring group. The Kitchen Committee will provide cleaning supplies. After an event, the sponsoring group is responsible for leaving the kitchen clean and all leftovers removed. Anything that is to be temporarily stored in the kitchen should be identified with the group's name. Unidentified items will be disposed of by the Kitchen Committee.

Every two weeks the Kitchen Committee members give the counter tops a thorough cleaning so that they are clean for food preparation. For this reason personal items such as coats, pocket books, umbrellas, or other items should not be placed on the counter tops. Please help the Kitchen Committee keep the kitchen clean for the next group that will be using it.
