I recently heard a joke about kindergarten children sharing their faith at "Show and Tell" time. One child said, "I am Muslim and I brought the prayer rug because I use it every day in prayer."

the Torah because it is our Holy Book." The last child said, "I'm Methodist and I brought a casserole because we like to eat at my church!"

At first this is a funny story. But then, as I begin to focus on it more, it becomes less funny and a bit disconcerting. Of all the things we talk about at church, preach about from the pulpit, teach about in Sunday School classes, read about from the Bible, and sing about in our hymns, how could a child think the most important part of being a part of Christ's church would be eating together?

What kinds of examples are we setting for our children in this church? What would they say is the most important? Would they believe that kindness is one of our virtues? Maybe, if they saw us doing good for one another. That certainly exists. Maybe they would think

we "love" one another because we always gather on Sunday mornings for fellowship, and we enjoy visiting with one another before and after worship. Maybe they would remember some joy because of the laughter heard in the hallways of the church each week. And maybe they would come to see Jesus as The One whom you and I seek to follow.

I pray that our children "see Jesus" in us. That, indeed, is our responsibility. We have promised to nurture the children (and each other!) through this church family. We have promised to be responsible for funding the programs of ministry and mission. We have placed our membership here, and some of us were baptized here, but all have promised to live our baptismal promises by working for the well-being of others through Christ's church.

Are each and every one of us living up to those expectations? Are we all contributing to the church from our personal finances, the work of our hands, our presence, our good words, and our prayers? Only you and God can answer those questions.

Remember the praise song, "In this very room, there's quite enough love for all the world." Let's live out our love of Jesus Christ in such a way that it becomes the most important aspect of church and life!

Bethel's PRESCHOOL Winter Fun and Playground UPDATE

The Preschool is getting back into its groove after our Christmas Break! We have begun to register our currently enrolled families for the 2019-2020 school year. On February 1, we will open enrollment to new families. The Preschool Board has voted to offer a discount for tuition for active church members in the preschool of 10% monthly. Please pass the word!

Our three and four-year-old children have been working with the letter "I". They even chiseled blocks of ice to remove bugs! It was a very cold experience, but they LOVED IT!

Remember that you are always welcome to come visit! We love to have people come be a guest reader (we will even give you the book) or maybe you would like to do an art project with our children or come talk about your profession or bring an instrument! Please let me know if you are interested, and we will set it up!




We would like to update the congregation on the playground situation. The Preschool Board has decided that it is best to do this in phases. The first phase is to have all the old equipment, except for the spring riders, tunnel and big playhouse, removed. We will have the grounds graded to help with erosion and install a border around the perimeter of the playground to keep the sand inside the fence. Next, we will relocate the spring riders, tunnel and place a NEW large play structure in the middle of the playground. The final piece is to



refurbish the sand. We will need approximately 60 TONS to bring the sand to a regulation level. We have all the funds necessary except for \$2500 to complete this phase! The cost of this first phase is the most expensive and will cost around \$20,000. At this point we have \$17,500. Phase 2 will be to install a new fence around the playground. Phase 3 will be to install a couple of other pieces of equipment including a spring seesaw, balance steps and shade structure.

This playground is not solely for the use of the preschool. This playground is for Bethel Church members, our children, grandchildren and great-grands as well as the surrounding community. Improving the playground will show the community and visitors that we care about children and that they are important to us! I am asking that the congregation prayerfully consider a donation to complete this phase so that the project can get started in the next month or two!

Bishop Wallace-Padgett says, "Our prayer focus is two-fold: We are praying that God will help us to fulfill the mission of the church, and we are praying to be one in Christ."

If there is ever a place where we can be one, it's in the space where we meet God.

4-Minutes Of Daily Prayer

The Council of Bishops is encouraging intentional engagement by United Methodists worldwide by asking everyone to pause and pray each day for the special-called General Conference from 2:23 through 2:26 a.m. or p.m.

If this time is not convenient for you, choose to pray at another time, but the council felt praying specifically at 2:23-2:26 p.m. which represent the dates of the special session of General Conference would be a helpful, effective, and unifying discipline for all United Methodists.

Prayer Guide

Invitation: We will begin with a moment of holy silence to allow for centering, settling, and focusing.

Minute #1 Prayer of Adoration

Good and great God, we recognize and celebrate that you are loving, kind, and faithful. You are everywhere in this world and beyond. You are also as close as our next breath. With John Wesley we rejoice knowing, "Best of all, you are with us."

Silence, concluding with unison prayer: "Hear our prayer, O God."

Minute #2 Prayer of Thanks

God of grace, we thank you that you hear us when we pray and are ever ready and able to act in ways beyond anything we could ask or imagine. Thank you for our brothers and sisters around the world, and especially

for those who have offered to serve by attending the special-called General Conference. Thank you for ordering our steps and for preparing a way.

Silence, concluding with unison prayer: "Hear our prayer, O God."

Minute #3: Prayer of Confession

Forgiving God, we confess that we have allowed fear and distrust to place distance between us and our brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ. Forgive us for making idols of our own thoughts, voices, and opinions. Thank you for forgiving us and for your perfect love that casts out all fear.

Silence, concluding with unison prayer: "Hear our prayer, O God."

Minute #4 Prayer of Asking

God of peace and wisdom, from this time forward, may we walk with you in trust and peace, and with our brothers and sisters in the love and unity you desire. May we truly sing together in harmony a song of praise that draws all to you. Even now, may you bless those who will attend the special-called General Conference, assuring them of your love, filling them with you wisdom, preparing them with your peace. May they and we become more sensitive to the voice of your Holy Spirit, so that all we do will please you and bring you glory. Silence, concluding with unison prayer: "Hear our

prayer, O God."
