## Jesus said, "Go and do likewise." Luke 10:37

The parable of the Good Samaritan is often said to be about hospitality. And it is. But it's also about Hospitality's close cousin, Generosity. Have you ever noticed that the Good Samaritan really goes above and **beyond?** He doesn't simply notice the man laying beside the Jericho Road. He doesn't just offer to call for help. Instead, he takes his own precious time AND his financial resources and offers them generously to a total stranger. He not only carries the injured man to safety, but pays for his continued care. He not only pays for one night's lodging, he tells the innkeeper to do whatever is needed and gives his word to come and pay the debt. It's pretty amazing when you think about it, really.

I always wonder, how did the conversation between this Good Samaritan and his family go when he arrived home that evening. "Honey, you won't believe....the most surprising thing happened to me today when I was on the Jericho road!" His spouse or other family members might have chastised him: "You stopped for a Jew? You could have been killed! They hate us, you know." Or what about this, "You spent how much money? On a perfect stranger?"

Or maybe his family was just awfully proud of him. We don't know. What we do know is that Jesus commended him for his behavior. He put himself out there - put himself at risk. He did something that appears, at first glance, to be reckless. **He went out of his way with his generosity.** He did this because he knew it mattered and he knew he had the ability, with the resources he had been entrusted with, to save a life.

Can I tell you something? Something that really matters? **You, too, have the chance to save a life.** In fact, you are already doing so. There are people who walk through the doors of Bethel United Methodist Church and experience a love so dramatic, so complete, so true that their lives are changed. Utterly transformed. Such is the power of God's love working through us. It almost takes your breath away, doesn't it?

Jesus encourages his listeners, "Go, and do the same." Go, be like the Good Samaritan. Go, tell this story to others. Go, take seriously what you've heard here today.

We here at Bethel are called to "Go, and do the same." We, too, have the opportunity to save lives - both literally and in a transformational sense. What a gift. What an honor. Thanks be to God.

## Pastor Julies Prayer Series, Month #1

With so many competing demands on our time, we can't always make it to church on Sunday. How do we continue to grow in our Christian faith? How do we find spiritual sustenance and meaning? One of the answers is: Prayer!

Over the next few months I will be sharing information on different prayer practices with you in our monthly newsletter. It is my hope that each of these may be of blessing to you and your family! For this month we'll start with young children- a great time to start teaching prayer!

Anyone with a toddler can speak to the power of imitation. They start to imitate our gestures, our actions, our rituals, sometimes surprising us with how much attention they pay to the things we were sure they didn't see or hear. (Travis and I have surely learned this lesson with our three!) Young children are learning all the time! They especially learn from our example. Our prayer practices are no exception. Little ones learn about God by watching us.

There are many possibilities when praying with young children, I'll focus on just a few. One way of praying, even with the very littlest of babies is to pray God's blessings over them. The words can be as simple as "*God, bless this child and guide their life.*" Or it can be a long, sleepless complicated ramble of a prayer offered at 3 in the morning (I have prayed many of these prayers for my own children!) Whether they are asleep or awake, these prayers are covering our children and establishing a foundation.

During my time of hospital chaplaincy, one of the units under my care was the maternity ward. Only after scrubbing my hands and arms all the way up past my elbows would I be allowed to enter the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit where the Very Sick Babies were. I would go in and sometimes I'd get to lay a finger on their tiny bodies and sometimes there was no piece of them that was reachable through all the medical equipment.

I would pray over these little babies, prayers of comfort and healing and delight; prayers of accompaniment and hope. Sometimes their mothers were there to pray. Sometimes mama had her own healing to do and was not able to be with the babies. Sometimes dad would be there keeping vigil. I prayed over them all and it was the best part of my day. When we pray with the littlest of children, we recognize and celebrate the presence of God with them, and with us.

Another way of praying is to establish a gratitude practice. That sounds fancier than it really is. Have you read the children's classic *Goodnight Moon*? Perhaps you are a grandparent and you read it many moons ago but you still remember it. In this beautiful children's book, a bunny goes through a ritual of naming all the things in the room and then saying good night to them all. "Goodnight room. Goodnight moon. Goodnight cow jumping over the moon. Goodnight light, and the red balloon. Goodnight bears. Goodnight chairs" And so on. In a similar way we can pray gratitude with little ones while also helping their language acquisition. We can thank God for soft sheets in the crib. We can thank God for toys and tummy time. We can thank God for the moon as we say good night!



Finally, we can let our little ones see us praying, whether in our home, saying grace before meals, or praying in the evening or in church as we share joys and concerns, share in silence, speak words together, and even pray through our singing. Let them see us turning to God with our challenges. Let them hear us praising God for goodness. Let them experience the power of a community united in prayer.

There are many things competing for our time and attention in our world. We teach by example when we let the children in our lives see that God is important in our lives and that we can always make time for prayer.
