# Context

- The Grenfell Tower Tragedy in North Kensington on 14 June 2017, was an unprecedented disaster which resulted in the loss of 72 lives. The residents of the Lancaster West Estate (LWE) and wider community experienced significant loss of life, bereavement, displacement and trauma.
- The Lancaster West Neighbourhood Team (LWNT) was formed to provide high-quality neighbourhood services and create a model 21st century estate by listening to our residents, repairing and refurbishing every home, and creating opportunities for the whole community.
- Our continued challenge is to restore and maintain trust, provide a housing management service that meets the specific and diverse needs of this community, and delivers on a promise to create a model 21st century estate.

# **LWE Context**

#### People

- 795 properties managed on Lancaster West
- 80% households are BAME
- > 25% homes were overcrowded in 2018, this is still 10% in 2021
- I 0% have accessibility issue with their home
- > 5% households have at least one person who can't speak or read English

#### **Properties**

- 25% leaseholders (half of which are non-resident)
- Stock from 1930 1980
- Notting Dale Ward = 70% social housing
- Only one lift accessible block (of 15)

# How we Co-designed this Community Development Strategy

To develop this strategy, we have used existing community engagement and local demographic data. We have validated the priorities with the Lancaster West Residents' Association and have continued to refine the strategy using ongoing engagement with residents.

# What have we achieved to date? April 2021

Deliver additional income, employment, grants, training investment, or other funds for the residents and community groups serving Lancaster West

- **£1.4m** of additional income brought into the estate
- 45 local residents employed

- Developed and delivered a communications and engagement strategy, maximising impact and involvement of residents
- Strategies delivered
- Communications function in place
- 14% of estate engaged with on refurbishment plans

Developed the service offer for young people on the estate, and be able to show tangible outcomes and increased participation from this group

- Lancaster West Community Centre in place and activities taking place regularly
- Finding a new home for **Grenfell Nursery**
- Grenfell Arts Project implemented

Work with residents to deliver at least **one new space which meets the needs of the community**  2 spaces created:

- Unit 22 Baseline Studios Co-working hub
- Lancaster West Community Centre

### What have we achieved to date? April 2021

Our community development activities have gone from strength to strength. Over 30% of the Lancaster West Neighbourhood Team are now from the North Kensington area, we have offered 9 paid work placements and our LancWest Works scheme has recently been launched.

• **£1.4m of financial value** has been added to the estate and wider North Kensington in terms of income, donations, grants and other benefits that have a clear financial value.

# What have we achieved to date? April 2021

- We have worked with the LWRA and residents to secure £81k in grants and donations to reinvest into the immediate neighbourhood. (grants £53k, donations £28k) 17 grant applications have been made with five grants secured.
- The Community Development team also worked with the Lancaster West Residents' Association on their applications for the Neighbourhood Community Infrastructure Levy fund. We have offered help in terms of bid writing training, and insight in terms of the acute needs of Notting Dale Ward. We envisage that this will translate in improving the chances for the community independently securing additional funds for to aid Grenfell recovery and deliver wider community benefits.

### Case Study LancWest Works

...maximising financial and career opportunities LancWest Works (LWW) is LWNT's integrated employment support offer for residents. The offer provides job-carved paid internship opportunities within the Neighbourhood Team when roles can be identified. We also offer CV writing, LinkedIn and job application support for residents, as well as working with contractors and employer partners to develop more job opportunities.

LWNT have supported **45 residents into employment** to date. This includes **9 apprenticeship and paid internship roles** directly within different departments of LWNT through LWW.

Residents are also supported to sustain and progress within employment, with several of our paid interns earning substantive council contracts.

# Case Study Community Massages



...healthier and well In order to provide more local wellbeing activities for residents, LWNT have recently partnered with Community Massage to offer **free shiatsu and seated massages to LWE residents** each month at the Resource Centre based on the estate.

The sessions launched in July 2021 and feedback has been overwhelmingly positive so far. **30** residents have already been supported to get a massage at the **North Kensington Resource Centre** and are now able to tap into free follow-up offers with Community Massage, such as guided meditations and additional massage sessions.

# Case Study Lancaster West Tea Garden

The Lancaster West Tea Garden was established in August 2020 as a pilot scheme to transform 75m<sup>2</sup> of unused urban outdoor space into a garden oasis for residents to grow their own organic herbs and vegetables.



...living more sustainably on a garden estate, in a greener neighbourhood The Tea Garden has become the go-to location for residents who wish to rest, reflect and take a break from their busy lives as well as being a hub for multiple popup events delivered by the LWNT, RA and external stakeholders.

The Tea Garden has created several employment opportunities for residents, so far we have hired....

- **one** full-time community gardener
- one part-time garden assistant.
- Supported two volunteers in finding paid work in the horticulture sector.

The Tea Garden has developed a successful volunteering scheme with **28** volunteers contributing a total of **580 hours,** reinvesting **£6293.52** back into the estate.

### Case Study Co-designing a 21<sup>st</sup> Century Refurbishment

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...living in a connected community as drivers of change, experiencing improved levels of equality In 2018 we made a promise to the residents that we would co-design the upcoming refurbishment with them to turn Lancaster West into a 21<sup>st</sup> century estate.

During 2019 we asked residents to give us their priorities for their home and blocks so that we could ensure residents received the refurbishment that they wanted. Through our **open house events** to view our newly refurbished properties, and through **workshops** where we asked them to list proposed works in order of importance, we were able to determine the priority works for the majority of residents from each block. We were able to achieve between **38% & 86%** resident engagement across the estate.
