

Exercise B10.1: Identifying voice and case

This exercise focuses on nouns and verbs from the vocabulary lists for Chapter 9 and Chapter 10.

These sentences contain active and passive verbs. For each of the sentences:

- underline all the words that make up the verb
- identify the verb as active or passive, and name the tense
- identify the case of the nouns in **purple**

1. The **woman** was **waiting for** her husband.
2. For a long time he waited for **light**.
3. We were sailing in a **boat** with the brave sailors.
4. They used to be taught by their excellent **parents**.
5. **Soldiers**, although you were wounded, you were running away.
6. Your **parent** has been found!
7. You were looking for **ships** for the **sailors**.
8. The **crowd** was overcome by love.
9. The **enemy** were burning the ships.
10. **War** was being waged by our comrades.

expectō – *I wait for* – is followed by an accusative noun. It is important not to confuse this with the *for* which signals the dative case.
