We would like to propose a 2-person exhibit of our works Dig (Murphy) and Mamma's Boy (Freeman). Since the birth of our son Quinn in 2008, we have each explored the nature of parenthood and childhood in relation to the non-familial world. We (at least in the United States) live in a society that paradoxically lauds family as the core of all social values and yet resists supporting the needs of working parents and childhood education. At the same time, during our son's first three years of life, we witnessed significant environmental and social crises that his generation (and no double future generations as well) would inherit. We each separately began to explore issues of environment, learning, language, family and custodianship in relationship to the growth of both parent and child. The resulting works are similar in their visual density, complexity and media, but vary in their resolution to these conceptual concerns.

In his Dig series, Murphy combines charcoal drawings with digital photographs in Photoshop to create surreal and unsettling landscapes of discarded industrial technologies and decaying organic matter. Like the 16th century Dutch still-life painters exploring ideas of death, change and decay through their painterly representations of bones, fruit, and dead animals, Murphy explores the dynamic between industrial forms and their decay, ultimately creating industrial vanitases.

These works are all roughly 14" x 42" digital prints on cotton poplin, mounted to wood and then coated with wax. They also exist online as virtual 360º panoramas.

In Mamma's Boy, Freeman developed an elaborate back-and-forth between digital and physical collages, resulting in large (44" x 100") prints on tyvek, which are cut to their irregular edges and screwed directly to the wall. Freeman is very interested in the relationship between language and image. As Quinn's language skills went through a developmental explosion shortly after his second birthday, Freeman began cataloging his linguistic discoveries. In this series she reinterprets her son's verbal worldview by taking his concerns and considerations (trucks, dinosaurs, owls, etc.) and translating them into her own concerns (fossil fuels, locally grown food, etc.) in both analogue and digital formats. Although the works are very large, there is an extremely high degree of detail in them, reflecting how toddlers experience the world does not separate the macro- and microcosmic. Although these works are very large, another edition exists smaller and

Heather D. Freeman is Assistant Professor of Digital Media at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte where she teaches digital print, animation, video, installation and drawing. She grew up in Skillman, New Jersey and was heavily influenced by her parents' careers in the sciences. She holds a BA in Fine Art and German Studies from Oberlin College and an MFA in Studio Art from Rutgers University. Previously, Freeman worked as an art director, graphic designer, editor and animator in New York and New Jersey. She also taught art, graphic design and visual rhetoric since 2001 at various institutions including the University of Kentucky and Clemson University. Her work is regularly exhibited regionally and nationally and has appeared in international exhibitions in Canada, China, Cuba, Germany, Hungary, New Zealand, Sweden and Thailand. "I began Mamma's Boy during my residency at the McColl Center for Visual Art in Charlotte, North Carolina during the summer 2010. I decided to do this residency to kick-start my studio practice after the birth of my son Quinn in 2008. I discovered, however, that the long days in the studio focused my attentions on my absent son. I've always been interested in the relationship between language and image and since Quinn's language skills were going through a developmental explosion, I found myself trying to catalogue his linguistic discoveries and dwelling on them in his absence. In this series I reinterpret my son's verbal worldview by taking his concerns and considerations (trucks, dinosaurs, owls, etc.) and translating them into my own concerns. These works are portraits of my attempt to portray my son's Weltanschauung. These began as collages of public domain 3D models, printed on graph paper, which I then scanned and re-collaged with both public domain and personal photographs. Finally, I drew and wrote back into them digitally before printing."

<u>Jeff Murphy</u> has been working with digital media for more than a decade, exploring a wide range of production and publication techniques in a quickly advancing and dynamic field. He has exhibited on the World Wide Web in curated exhibits such as "@art" (the University of Illinois) and "Digitally Born" (the Alternative Museum, NY), developed interactive projects for both the Web and CD, and has presented his works in traditional gallery and museum settings with solo exhibitions at such places as The Mint Museum of Art, The University of Notre Dame, and The University of Colorado. His work has been published in a diverse array of publications including WIRED Magazine, World Art Magazine, and the textbook Exploring Color Photography. He has received individual artist grants from the Arts and Science Council, the Ohio Arts Council and the North Carolina Arts Council. Jeff is currently an Associate Professor of Art at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte where he teaches digital imaging, interactive design, photography, video, and animation. He received his BFA from the Ohio State University in 1989 and his MFA from the University of Florida in 1995.

"Dig explores the interplay between our industrial past, current development, and the natural world. I hope to intone a strong psychological undercurrent through both the iconography and the textural patinas created by the layering and collage of diverse elements. Like the 16th century Dutch still-life painters exploring the ideas of death, change and decay through their painterly representations of bones, fruit, and dead animals, I hope to explore the dynamic between industrial forms and their decay, ultimately creating a type of industrial vanitases. The bulk of these images as large murals on poplin cloth and other textiles, including canvas, but are also printed in small editions on Sateen cloth, mounted on wood, and coated with wax."

Aside from being artists, we are also both professors of Digital Media at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. We would be very interested in both lecturing on our work, and also holding workshops on any of the following:

- Digital Collage with Adobe Photoshop,
- Combining Digital and Traditional Collage,
- Animation in Adobe After Effects,
- Animation in Adobe Photoshop,
- Digital Printing on Alternative Substrates (metal, fabric, etc.)
- Copyright Basics for Collage Artists (aka Don't Get Sued for Snow White!),
- Experimental Sound in Audacity and GarageBand.

We each also teach courses in Flash, CSS, HTML, Adobe Illustrator and InDesign, and Video Editing and could also craft workshops around these topics, although we realize these tend to be for more advanced learners.

The difficulties with these sorts of workshops, of course, is that they generally require a computer lab with the requisite software or participants must bring their own laptops with the software. Because this is not always possible, we can also craft workshops that are more demonstration-based (rather than participation-based) workshops. Combining Digital and Traditional Collage, Digital Printing on Alternative Substrates, and Copyright Basics for Collage Artists especially lend themselves to this approach.
