TLRP is the largest education research programme in the UK. A generic portfolio of projects, across the lifecourse, began in 2000 and will continue until 2009. More focused work on Technology Enhanced Learning will reach towards 2012. Dissemination and impact work extends across the entire period.

The cumulative programme budget totals some £43m – with major contributions from the Higher Education Funding Council for England, Government Education Departments in England, Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales, the UK Research Councils and JISC.

TLRP is managed by the Economic and Social Research Council and is guided by ESRC's principles of quality, impact and independence.

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


THEMES


