On Saturday, 15th April 1989 (150489) I attended the football Match at Sheffield. We went to the match by private car. There was my father, John Alfred ANDERSON, and . They were both friends of my father's so I don't know any more about them. We are all Liverpool Supporters. I had bought my ticket some weeks before as I am a Season Ticket Holder. I had paid £6 for the ticket which was for the Standing area. We used the Motorway Network to get to the ground. We didn't stop on the way. When we got near the ground the Police directed us passed the Nottingham Forrest End of the Ground so we had to drive right around before we could park. We parked in a side road near the Railway Station. It was about 1.30 pm when we left the car. We went to a nearby pub for a drink, before starting out for the ground at about 2.15 pm. There was a number of

supporters at the Pub I had been drinking in. There was no problems with anyone. I saw Policeman standing on street corners on the way to the ground. They were behind crowd barriers across the side streets as if to stop supporters using those. When I got towards the turnstiles at about 2.25 pm. The whole of the Courtyard was full of people. There was two Police Horses and Riders but the whole area was packed. There was no directions being given by the Police as far as I could tell. It seemed to me that some of the turnstiles had been closed. We made our way to the right of the crush, we ducked under a barrier. I saw a gate being opened to the right of the turnstiles. We walked straight in no one asked for our tickets no Stewards or Police were there as we walked through the gate. I think we must have been the first people through the gate. I didn't see any bad behavior by fans outside the ground. I didn't see anyone trying to climb fences or trying to get unauthorised entrance. When we got through the gate I could see the pitch through the tunnel under the Stands. I had been to the ground on previous occasions and stood on the left hand side of the stairs. We walked along the tunnel, there was very few people about we walked to the left of the fence into Pen 4. There was no Police control or Stewards controlling this area of the ground. As we walked into Pen 4, I saw that we couldn't walk to the left because of side fencing. I hadn't realised we couldn't move right across to the left of the stands. I didn't see any disorder on the way into the Pen, or see any supporters drinking in the ground. Pen 4 was quite full I was separated from my father at about 2K on the Grid Reference. I was pushed forward by a sudden crush down to 4K There was a barrier in front of me. My right arm was crushed against against the barrier and could hardly breath. When I moved down towards the barrier I wasn't being pushed hard immediately, I seemed to filter forwards through the crowd.

But the crush came very hard then and I was pushed hard against the barrier. When the crush came I was forced partially forward leaning over the top of the barrier. I was squashed against a man on my left. I was being crushed against him, forcing him onto the barrier. He was wearing a white jacket, he had blonde hair, aged about 30 years. He looked as if he might be in a bad way. But there was nothing I could do to help him. I didn't see anything of the start of the game. I suppose I must have been at my viewing position at about 2.55 pm. I lost all sense of time. But after a while I was able to work my way towards the back of the Pen towards the stands. Someone lifted me up into the stands. By reaching down and pulling me up. It was at that time that I realised I had lost the use of my right arm. I think it was about 3.15 pm by then. I believe there was film of me on the television being hoisted out of the Pen. There was confusion every where I didn't take much notice of what was around me I was just trying to get out. People in the sealed area lifted a few people out of the pen.

Others seemed to be standing up looking around. I didn't look down, I could see a Policeman by the goal pulling at the fence in front of the crowd. I was anxious to get out I went down the steps from the stand. I walked out of the courtyard between the turnstiles and the River was a number of people lying dead. I think they had been carried to that position. I saw that my Father was one of their number. I stayed with him for a while.

I live at the above address with my wife and children. My father is John Alfred ANDERSON, N675 [redacted] of [redacted] Liverpool [redacted].

On the morning of Saturday 15 April 1989 I left Liverpool for Sheffield along with my father and two of his friends, who I only know as [redacted] and [redacted]. [redacted] N2041 is about [redacted] years old and [redacted] N1081 about [redacted] yrs. We attended at Sheffield in order to go to the FA Cup Semi Final between Liverpool F.C. and Nottingham FC. We drove to the ground in my fathers car, parked the car on the A61. The car is a Renault 18 Registered Number [redacted]. We then got to the ground at about 2.30 pm. Entered the outer perimeter gates and joined a large crowd of people at the turnstiles. CAT. It was not an orderly queue and people were not moving through the turnstiles at all and others were joining all the time. At one stage the gates behind us were closed.

Everyone in the crowd at the turnstiles appeared to be getting crushed. I found it difficult to breath and I know that my father was because he complained of it. We waited in this crowd for about five minutes at which time we decided to step out of the crowd to a quieter spot. From where we were stood we would not have entered the ground because we weren't at the turnstiles. The crowd would be about two to three thousand and I saw lots of people around me getting crushed.

At about ^{S06 -} 2.50 pm the ^{GATE C.} Police opened a large gate to the right hand side of the turnstiles and our party rushed in as did all the crowd at the turnstiles. We went ^{CAT} down a tunnel but were literally carried along with the surge of the crowd. We went to the left side of the terrace and the sheer numbers of the crowd forced my father to be carried away from me to my left.

I then lost sight of him. I quickly realised that I was in difficulty as I had been pushed up against a crash barrier and couldn't move. The pressure was intense and other people around me were crushed ^{Barrier Ren 4} shouting 'I'm dying, I'm dying.' I shouted it as well as I couldn't breath and thought that I was dying. After some ten minutes, the pressure was relieved, firstly at the front and I managed to get in front of the barrier. The pressure then eased from the back and I went to the rear of the terrace and managed to climb up into the stand above the terrace. ^{Seated -}

Once in the stand I looked down at the terrace and saw people and the ^{POL FENCE} Police breaking the perimeter barriers down to get them onto the pitch to relieve the pressure. I also saw several people motionless layed on the terraces but I wasn't aware they were dead. I couldn't bring myself to look at the scene so decided to leave the ground and try and look for my dad. When I came out of the stand I saw bodies laying on the floor behind the stand with items of clothing and

blankets covering their faces so I realised some people were dead. I was looking at the bodies to see if I could find my father and saw that he was in fact one of them. I realised that he was dead and I identified him there and then to Police Constable 520 Hogg.
