

Everyone in the growd at the turnstiles appeared to be getting crushed. I found it difficult to breath and I know that my father was because he complained of it. We waited in this crowd for about five minutes at which time we decided to step out of the crowd to a quieter spot. From where we were stood we would not haveentered the ground because we weren't at the turnstiles. The crowd would be about two to three thousand and I saw lots of people around me getting crushed.

At about 2.50 pm the Police opened a large gate to the right hand side of the turnstiles and our party rushed in as did all the crowd at the turnstiles. We went down a tunnel but were literally carried along with the surge of the crowd. We went to the left side of the terrace and the sheer numbers of the crowd forced my father to be carried away from me to my left.

I then lost sight of him. I quickly realised that I was in difficulty as I had been pushed up against a crash barrier and couldn't move. The pressure was intense and other people around me were shouting 'I'm dying, I'm dying.' I shouted it as well as I couldn't breath and thought that I was dying. After some ten minutes, the pressure was relieved, firstly at the front and I managed to get in front of the barrier. The pressure then eased from the back and I went to the rear of the terrace and managed to climb up into the stand above the terrace.

Once in the stand I looked down at the terrace and saw people and the Police breaking the perimeter barriers down to get them onto the pitch to relieve the pressure. I also saw several people motionless layed on the terraces but I wasn't aware they were dead. I couldn't bring myself to look at the scene so decided to leave the ground and try and look for my dad. When I came out of the stand I saw bodies laying on the floor behind the stand with items of clothing and

was looking at the bodies to see if I could find my father and saw that he was in fact one of them. I realised that he was dead and I identified him there and then to Police Constable I stayed there for a while and then, - All ol until this incident my father was in good health and employed as a security man at an office building. In my opinion the whole problem arose because people were not getting through the turnsiles quick enough. Once outside the ground after the incident I saw and he was I have informed my mother of the alright, but I have not seen death of my father. At 8.50 pm the same day I attended at the gymmasium at Sheffield Wednesday Football Ground. Police Constable 520 Hagg there showed to me, a photograph bearing the number 76. I identified that as being a 1-0m photograph of my father. I was then shown the body of my father whom
