

SECTION C2: ENGLISH TO LATIN SENTENCES

Exercise C2.1: Nominative and accusative nouns

In each of the following sentences, either the subject or the object is in **purple**. Look at the Latin words in brackets and choose the right one to translate this noun: if the noun is the subject, you need a noun in the nominative case; if the noun is the object, you need a noun in the accusative case.

Remember to check whether the noun is singular or plural.

e.g. The **king** praised his son.

(**rēx**) / rēgem)

1. The daring Greek threw the **spear**.

(hasta / hastam)

2. The brave woman took the **arrows**.

(sagittae / sagittās)

3. The **sword** was huge.

(gladius / gladii)

4. The **bodies** were near the river.

(corpus / corpora)

5. The children feared the **danger**.

(periculum / pericula)

6. The Greek **spears** remained near the river.

(hastās / hastae)

7. We feared **war**.

(bella / bellum)

8. The **wood** was not huge.

(silva / silvam)

9. The **river** was near the wood.

(flūmen / flūmina)

10. There was **danger** near the arrows.

(periculum / pericula)
